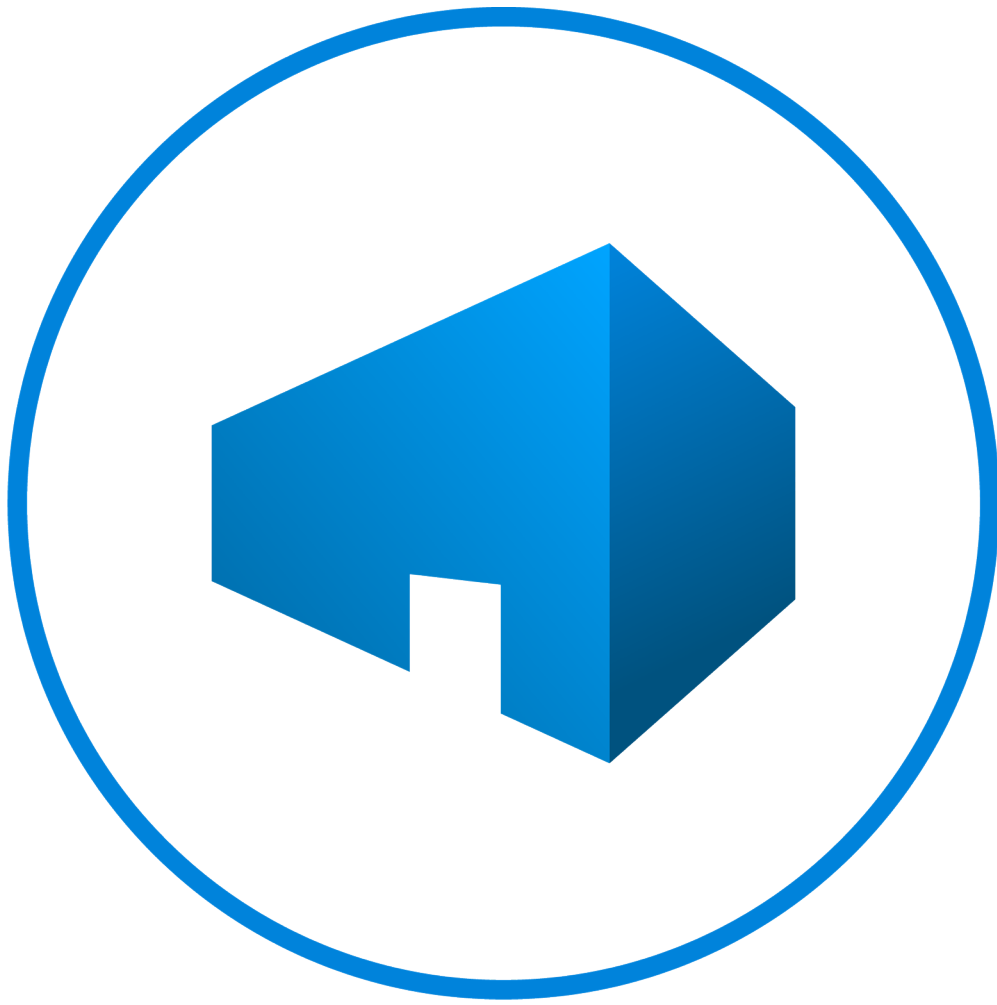




Bluebeam Studio Enterprise 3.2 Troubleshooting Guide

Revised June 2023

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Introduction

Use this guide as your go-to support resource for troubleshooting and diagnosing common issues related to end users, the application server, and the SQL server. The intended audience for this guide is system and network administrators, as well as your database administrator.

Note: *Studio Enterprise is in a phased End Of Life Support Cycle. Please refer to our [EOL Phased Support Cycle](#) for further details.*

This guide is not meant to replace your IT team that manages your Studio Enterprise environment, but as a support resource to aid in troubleshooting and maintaining a healthy and functional Studio Enterprise Environment.

If your Studio Enterprise environment or your end users experience issues after verifying the above environmental checks, our [General Troubleshooting](#) section should help resolve most common issues. This section includes [Studio Outage - General Steps for Resolution](#) for troubleshooting steps and recommendations related to a general outage where users are unable to connect.

Note: *For the purposes of this document, the term “Studio server” refers to the machine that Studio Enterprise is being installed on. The Studio Enterprise server may also be referred to as the “application server”.*

Maintaining a Healthy Environment

System Requirements, Recommendations, and Best Practices

Ensure you follow all system and hardware requirements from the [Studio Enterprise Installation and Configuration Guide](#). These are strict requirements. If they are not met, Studio Enterprise will likely exhibit undesired behavior and not work as designed.

Minimum Server CPU and RAM Recommendations

These recommendations depend on several factors and are not guaranteed to fit every environment. Factors such as the number of connected users, the number of requests and traffic to and from the server, types of activity occurring, size of files and markups, etc. all have effects on performance. The table below illustrates our general recommendations. These recommendations assume the following, as seen in the [Studio Enterprise Installation and Configuration Guide](#):

- Dedicated Servers:
 - Ensure that SQL Server is being used solely for Studio Enterprise.
 - Studio Enterprise and Microsoft SQL Server are installed on separate servers.
- Data transfer speeds between Studio Enterprise and SQL servers are adequate.
- SQL Instance setup to Microsoft's recommendations.
- At least 1 Gigabit connection between SQL and Application server.

Studio Enterprise Server Recommendations

You should refer to our [Studio Enterprise 3.2 Upgrade Guide](#) for operating system and SQL server recommendations. In addition:

- Be sure the server meets Studio Enterprise compatibility and other requirements outlined in the following articles:
 - [Studio Enterprise Installation and Configuration Guide](#)

- Disable Windows Search indexing.
By default, Windows indexing is disabled by Windows Server. However, Windows Search indexing is enabled by default. Studio Enterprise manages project files within the Windows file system, and any files created or updated while indexing is enabled will invoke the Windows Search indexer to create or update file metadata.
- Use system storage (C: volume) with high IOPS physical drive.
When a file is posted to a ASP.NET application, the files are temporarily stored, by default, on the C: volume. Performance of the drive will impact upload performance. Files beyond a defined threshold are stored within the local file system instead of memory. Uploaded PDFs will easily surpass the predefined, default 256KB threshold.
- Ensure disk capacity does not Surpass 87.5% (NTFS formatted drives only).
By default, Windows volumes are formatted with NTFS. Behind the scenes, NTFS utilizes a master file table (MFT) to string together the file directory tree along with metadata such as creation and update dates. NTFS will reserve 12.5% of the volume to be used by the MFT to store that information. If utilization fills up, the MFT and new file data will be in contention for the remaining space.
- Consider using a higher performing CPU and memory profile to improve performance.

SQL Server Recommendations

Ensure a database administrator (DBA) assists with setting up the SQL environment and configuring it for best practices. In addition:

- Be sure the SQL server meets Studio Enterprise compatibility and other requirements outlined in the following articles:
 - [Studio Enterprise Installation and Configuration Guide](#)
 - [Studio Enterprise Compatibility Reference](#)
 - [Supported server operating systems and versions of SQL Server](#)
- Use a dedicated SQL instance.
 - Ensure the SQL Server is being used solely for Studio Enterprise.
 - Studio Enterprise and Microsoft SQL Server must be installed on separate servers.
- Ensure the Studio database is set to grow unlimited and at minimum 1GB growth rate.
- Reindex the database to mitigate any performance degradation. Try to keep fragmentation below 15%.
- Ensure the Studio database is on a "non-system Storage" (external) high IOPS physical drive.
- Continually monitor disk space to ensure the database is not reaching maximum drive capacity.
- Consider using a higher performing CPU and memory profile to improve performance.
- If needed, run the "exec sp_updatestats" command on both databases, during off-peak hours, to reduce latency.
- Ensure regular database maintenance is set up to maintain database health. SQL maintenance is to ensure that the database continues performing optimally. These are standard database practices not specific to Studio Enterprise that should be performed by your DBA. Our recommendations are:
 - Backup – Full Backup of All Databases (daily)
 - Backup – Transaction Logs (every 15 minutes)
 - Check database integrity (daily)
 - Reorganize index (daily)
 - Update statistics (daily)
 - Rebuild index (weekly) – It's best to keep fragmentation below 15% if possible.

Environmental Checks

Use the information in this section to investigate Studio Enterprise environment issues, or to ensure you're running a healthy/optimized environment.

General

- Ensure the application server and SQL server meet all requirements listed in these documents.
 - [Studio Enterprise Compatibility Reference](#)
 - [Supported SQL versions](#) (SQL Express is not supported for production)
- Check network bandwidth and usage. Determine whether issues occur if you switch to another network.
- Check CPU/RAM usage on the Studio Enterprise server and SQL servers to ensure resources are sufficient for the application and SQL.
- Test to determine which specific action is slow (connecting, Session upload/download, Project upload/download/check-out). Perform this test on multiple Revu client systems.
 - Are Sessions working as they should?
 - Are Projects working properly?
- Have any changes been made to SQL, Active Directory, Studio Enterprise server, certificates, etc. around the time you started receiving reports of the issue? If so, investigate those changes or roll them back if needed.

- When users sign into Studio, are they selecting the "Use Windows Authentication" box, domain/user, or using an email address?
- Verify the available disk space on both the application server and the SQL server. Be sure the SQL database is not full and is free to grow.
 - The database and translation log may become full. As a result, no more space is available to write to the database, which can cause serious issues.
- What version of Revu is being used?
Note: Studio Enterprise 3.2 supports Revu 20 and Revu 21.
- Check for pending Windows updates on the servers.

Studio Enterprise Server

- On the Studio Enterprise server, ensure the Microsoft Message Queuing (MSMQ), Bluebeam Studio Job Queue, and Bluebeam Studio Services are all running.
 - Check **Studio Enterprise Administrator** > **Status** and verify an IP address appears in the Hostname field. If so, change the hostname to the server FQDN. You must restart the server for the change to take effect.
 - Ensure the portal is accessible and an administrator can log in. To open the portal, enter the server name in a web browser.
Example: https://bluebeam.[company].com
Note: Ensure you are using an "https" URL, because "http" will not work properly.
- Ensure at least .NET 4.5 is installed and in a healthy state.
 - Reinstall or repair .NET if you suspect an issue.
 - You can run a Microsoft .NET Framework Repair Tool to see if there are any errors in the .NET configuration on the application server. The repair tool can be found [here](#).
- Ensure the IIS version meets compatibility requirements and is running in a healthy state.
 - Check IIS to ensure site is running and app pool is running.
 - Perform an IISRESET from an elevated command prompt if there's an issue.

SQL Server

- Verify the BluebeamCache database exists on the SQL server.
- Verify SQL is running and test the connection to the SQL server via the Bluebeam Studio Enterprise Administrator console.
 - Open the SQL Server Configuration Manager and ensure the SQL Server service is running and has the correct service account.
 - The "Windows Authentication" check box requires SE 3.1 or above and Revu 2015 or above.
- Ensure Studio Database maintenance jobs are set up to be run on a regular basis.
 - This includes back up, defrag, and reindexing jobs.
 - These should be setup by the DBA.

General Troubleshooting

Studio Outage - General Steps for Resolution

These general error resolution steps can be used for a variety of issues and will either help resolve the issue or rule out many possible causes.

If the issue is specific to a single user, clearing their cache or resetting their settings may resolve the issue for the user. In this case, reference [this article](#) to reset settings and reference the [Clearing Revu Client Session Cache](#) or the [Clearing Revu Client Project Cache](#) sections on this document to clear cache. If the issue affects all users, try the following solutions:

- Follow steps found in this [support article](#).
- Test the connection to the Studio Enterprise server from another Revu client. Make note if this issue is user specific.
- Test the connection to the SQL server via the Database Connection tab in the Bluebeam Studio Enterprise Administrator console on the Studio Enterprise server.
- Try the following solutions to recycle the Bluebeam Studio application and hopefully correct possible issues with the SQL server. Ensure the servers in question have valid recent backups.
 - Restart the SQL Server.
 - Restart the Studio Enterprise Application Server.
 - Restart IIS (Internet Information Services) on the application server (via command line as an admin by entering the following: `iisreset /restart`).
 - Restart the Bluebeam Services from the Studio Enterprise Administrator application (Tools > Restart Server) - You may need to run this restart twice.

Note: On the Studio application server, please ensure the Microsoft Message Queuing (MSMQ), Bluebeam Studio Job Queue, and Bluebeam Studio Service are all running.

WARNING: Restarting the Bluebeam Services will cause a momentary loss of connection for active users. Restarting the server or any Bluebeam Services should be done in a maintenance window to avoid downtime for the users. Revu has an Offline mode that will allow them to continue working while the services restart, but as a best practice we recommend performing any disruptive changes during non-business hours.

- Check the Studio Enterprise portal in a web browser and verify you can log in.
Note: Be sure to use "https" rather than "http".
- If these suggestions do not solve the issue, investigate the logs (details below) and correlate issues to possible Problem/Solutions found in this package.
- Read through the [Environmental Checks](#) section to ensure you are running a healthy/optimized environment.

Log Files

When you're troubleshooting issues in a Studio Enterprise environment, you can use the associated logs as a valuable resource. Here are details on where the logs can be found and what to expect.

Note: *Studio Enterprise has advanced into its EOL phase and Bluebeam Support cannot assist with reviewing these log files. Please use these log files with your Studio Server administrative team to help with issue resolution.*

Log File Locations

- Studio Enterprise logs
 - Select **Bluebeam Studio Enterprise Administrator Application > File > Show Logs**.
 - Default location: C:\Windows\Temp\Bluebeam Software
 - Also check:
 - The Bluebeam Studio Administrator log:
C:\Users\[ServiceAccount]\AppData\Local\Temp\Bluebeam Software (aka %temp%)
 - C:\Windows\ServiceProfiles\NetworkService\AppData\Local\Temp\Bluebeam Software
- Studio Enterprise install logs
 - C:\Users\[account]\AppData\Local\Temp
 - Look for logs starting with "Bluebeam_Studio_"
- Check Event Viewer Application and System Logs for errors:
 1. Click the Windows Start button.
 2. In the search bar, type "Event Viewer", then press **Enter**.
 3. In the Event Viewer, expand **Windows Logs**.
 4. Check both Application Logs and System Logs for errors.
- Select **Revu > Preferences > Admin** then click **Explore Log Folder** to investigate the Revu client logs. The most recent Revu.log usually supplies needed context.

Log Contents

The logs below can be found by opening the Studio Enterprise Administrator, then selecting **File > Show Logs**.

- ActiveDirectoryAdminPortal
 - AD related issues while in the Studio Portal. E.G. LDAP Configuration.
 - AD connection issues.
- AutoMapReport
 - AD Automapping information.
- Discovery
 - Related to Revu clients making requests to discover the other endpoints, like Portal and SignalR, in Studio.
- HTTPService
 - For the iPad application. Communication and errors related to Revu iPad can be found here.
- JobQueue
 - Emails and other non-real-time processes.
 - Project and Session Purge Service.
- Portal
 - Errors that occur while using the Studio Portal.
- SignalR
 - Connection issues for Studio Sessions.
 - General SignalR disconnections.

- StudioServer

Useful in most circumstances because you learn the following information:

 - Connection and general issue Information.
 - Possible user login information.
 - SignalR disconnections per user.
- WCFService
 - Connection and general issue information.
 - May contain user login information.
 - File uploads and other non-real-time operations.
- WebAPI

Useful in most circumstances because you learn the following information:

 - Connection and General Issue Information.
 - May contain user login information.
 - File uploads and other non-real-time operations.

Data Transfer Test — Troubleshooting Performance Issues

You can use the following test to ensure that the Studio Enterprise server and the SQL server have sufficient transfer speeds. Testing the transfer speeds from the Studio Enterprise server to an end user would also be beneficial to test.

Note: Do not perform this test if you use an RDP viewer to remote connect into each machine, because the transfer rate over RDP is not a true test of server-to-server transfer speeds.

1. Complete the following steps:
 - a. Create a file share on the SQL server to which everyone can write.
 - b. Map a shared drive on the web server to the target share.
 - c. Copy a large (300+ MB) file from the shared drive on the web server to the share mapped on the SQL server.
 - d. Note the exact file size and the time taken for the transfer.
 - e. Delete the mapped drive and the share.
2. Calculate data transfer rate:
 - Example 1 (GB converted to MB/seconds):
 - 1.8GB file
 - 1.8GB = 1800MB
 - 1 GB = 1000 MB (in decimal). Use decimals when calculating
 - 1 GB = 1024 MB (in binary)
 - Transfer time 11 seconds
 - $1800/11 \text{ seconds} = 163.63\text{MB/s}$ (Good)
 - Example 2 (MB/seconds):
 - 300MB file
 - Transfer time 10 minutes (10 minutes * 60 seconds = 600 seconds)
 - $300/600 \text{ seconds} = 0.5\text{MB/s}$ (Bad)
 - Example 3(MB/minutes):
 - 558MB file
 - Transfer time 1 hour 30 minutes (90 minutes)
 - $558/90 = 6.2\text{MB/m}$ (Bad)

Install Issues

Installation Fails as a Result of Incompatible Software

Problem

General installation issues that may be related to software/OS version or compatibility.

Solution

- Ensure you followed procedures in the [Studio Enterprise Installation and Configuration Guide](#) during installation process.
- For Production use, ensure you are not using SQL Express.
- Be sure SQL and Studio Enterprise are running on separate servers.
- Be sure you are running a supported Windows Server operating system for the [application server](#) and the [SQL server](#).
- Be sure you are running a [supported version of SQL Server](#).
- Ensure all Service Accounts are members of **Local Administrators group** and their passwords do not expire.
- Check the install logs.
 - C:\Users\[account]\AppData\Local\Temp – Look for logs starting with “Bluebeam_Studio_”.

Windows Authentication for SQL Connection During Installation

Problem

You receive the “Unable to validate the account [Service Account]” error during installation.

Solution

Add the domain account that was being used as the service account for the SQL connection to the Local Administrators group on both the SQL server and the application server.

Failed to Start Bluebeam Services During Installation Error

Problem

Bluebeam Services (Bluebeam Studio Job Queue and Bluebeam Studio) do not start during installation.

Solution

Re-issue the site certificate. Install the certificate and ensure it is trusted. The certificate must be installed in the Personal certificate store at the local machine level on the Studio Enterprise server. Then re-install Studio Enterprise.

Studio Enterprise Server Migration

If you are planning to move your Studio Enterprise server, are only the IP and MAC address changing?

If so, the good news is that the IP and MAC addressing should not impact the license, because the license is registered to the server computer name and not tied to hardware addressing.

If you are changing the server hostname, you must ensure you change the name everywhere. This includes the machine name, hostname in the Studio Enterprise Administrator, Certificate, URL in IIS, etc. Before you perform this migration, we recommend you unregister the Studio Enterprise server.

1. Open the Bluebeam Studio Enterprise Administrator.
2. Select **Tools > Unregister**.

After you make the necessary changes, use the Studio Enterprise Administrator to register the server and to ensure the license is properly applied.

Connection Issues

General Troubleshooting for Connection Issues

Note: *If this troubleshooting solution does not resolve the issue, and there's a connection issue that is not obvious, it could be related to a proxy, DNS routing, firewall, or other networking issue that may require your security team to packet trace (Wireshark, Fiddler, or Microsoft Message Analyzer) the users' connections and determine which endpoints the Studio connection is going through.*

Problem

Users are unable to connect to your Studio Enterprise server with Revu.

Solutions

- Start troubleshooting connection issues by using steps in the following support article:

- Check for hostname misconfiguration:
 - Compare machine name, hostname in the Studio Enterprise Administrator, Certificate, URL in IIS, and URL shown against endpoints in Revu logs.
 - Check for discrepancies.
- Check for certificate issues:
 - Run your web browser as Administrator and open your Studio Enterprise portal URL.
 - Check the certificate to verify it is trusted, still valid, and not expired.
 - If there is a certificate error check the [Certificate Issues](#) section.
- Try the steps found in the [General Error Resolution](#) section.

SignalR Error – Sessions Can't Connect

Problem

Users are unable to connect to Sessions on the Studio Enterprise server.

Solution

Do "SignalR: closed" errors appear in the Revu.log logs for the user or in the SignalR.log on the Studio Enterprise server? If so, SignalR is the real-time component necessary for Sessions to function. SignalR protocol must be allowed on network communications for Sessions to work properly. The Bluebeam services needed for this to function may be down or need a restart.

1. Open the Bluebeam Studio Administrator on the Studio Enterprise Server.
2. Select **Tools > Restart Server**.

After you restart Bluebeam Services, try to access one of your Sessions again.

WARNING: *Restarting the Bluebeam Services will cause a momentary loss of connection for active users. Restarting the server or any Bluebeam Services should be done during a maintenance window to avoid downtime for the users. Revu has an Offline mode that allows users to continue working while the services restart, but as a best practice we recommend performing any disruptive changes during non-business hours.*

You must ensure the "Bluebeam Studio Application Pool" is started in Application Pool section of Internet Information Services (IIS) on the Studio Enterprise server.

If these steps don't resolve the issue, see the [Can Connect to Projects but Not Sessions](#) section.

Unknown Error in Revu When Applying Permissions or Attendee Access Settings in Revu

Problem

When attempting to modify attendee access or permissions settings for Studio Sessions or Projects in Revu, users receive an "Unknown Error". Users may also receive "Unknown Error" when attempting to connect to Studio Enterprise server.

- This issue is usually related to HTTP verbs, like GET, PUT, DELETE being blocked on the Studio server.
- As a result of this error, users may be unable to modify Session/Project permissions and uploading markups to Sessions may fail.

Solution

- WebDAV can be configured to block or allow verbs. However, WebDAV is not required for the Studio Server to work, so you can safely disable it.
- The WebAPI.log Studio log file is where you would see the HTTP verbs being communicated to Studio from the Clients.
- Disable WebDAV.

If you choose to disable WebDAV, we recommend disabling the feature through the Server Manager. Edit web.config only if the server requires WebDAV for another reason.

1. Use the Server Manager to uninstall/disable WebDAV as a Server Role.
2. Restart IIS.
3. Restart Bluebeam Services.

TLS Issue – Unable to Connect Using Revu 2016 and Older

Problem

Revu versions 2016 and below are unable to connect to Studio Enterprise, because those versions don't support TLS 1.2.

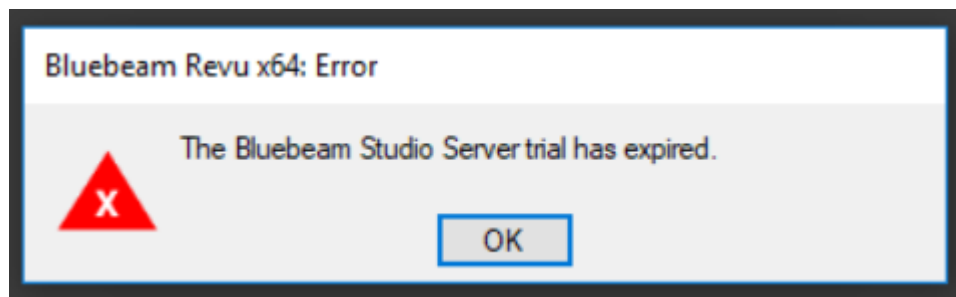
Solution

- We recommend upgrading any users with 2016 or below to a newer version.
- If it is not possible to upgrade to a newer version, ensure TLS 1.0 is enabled and ensure that Strong Ciphers are not forced.
- We also recommend running a .NET repair tool to see if there are any issues with .NET on the Studio Enterprise (SE) server. <https://www.microsoft.com/en-us/download/details.aspx?id=30135>

Studio Server Trial Expired Error in Revu When Trying to Login

Problem

The Studio Enterprise server has been registered and working, and users suddenly receive an error stating, "The Bluebeam Studio Server Trial has expired" when attempting to log in.



The JobQueue service places a token in the database every hour that is set to expire in 2 hours. If this service crashes or stops, the license can "expire" after 2 hours.

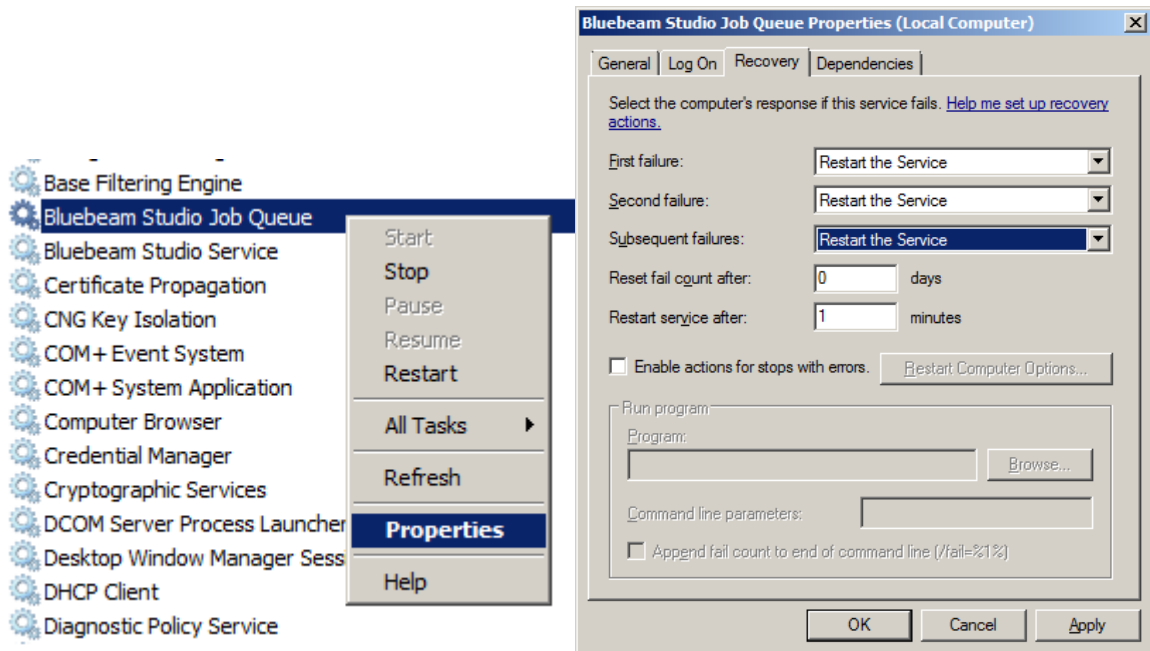
Solutions

Try the following solutions:

- Restart the Bluebeam Services from the Studio Enterprise Administrator. (Select **Tools > Restart Server**). You may need to select **Restart Server** a second time.

WARNING: Restarting the Bluebeam Services will cause a momentary loss of connection for active users. Restarting the server or any Bluebeam Services should be done during a maintenance window to avoid downtime for the users. Revu has an Offline mode that allows users to continue working while the services restart, but as a best practice we recommend performing any disruptive changes during non-business hours.

- Re-enter the users' serial numbers and product keys.
- Set services to automatically recover in the event of a failure.
 1. Open services.msc on the Studio Enterprise server.
 2. Right-click the two Bluebeam Services, and go to Properties.
 3. Select the Recovery tab.
 4. Configure the failures to Restart the Service.

Users Can Connect to Projects but Not Sessions

Problem

Users can connect to Projects, but are unable to connect to Sessions.

Solutions

Try the following solutions:

- Ensure users are running Revu 20 or Revu 21.
- Ensure the BluebeamCache database exists on the SQL server.
- Open the Studio Enterprise Administrator Status to verify the hostname is the FQDN, rather than an IP address. If necessary, change the value to the server FQDN.
Note: You must restart the server for the change to take effect.
- Reference the [SignalR](#) section if the listed solutions don't help.

Internal Users Can Connect but External Users Cannot

Problem

Users on the internal network can connect, but users on an external network cannot connect.

Solutions

Try the following solutions:

- Verify that a proxy is present. If so:
 - Ensure URLs are properly routed.
 - Ensure proxy re-authentication is disabled for the server URL.
- Ensure firewalls are configured correctly and allow external traffic.
- Ensure a public IP is being used.
- If the external user is using a VPN, ensure it is set up to allow connection to the Studio Enterprise server.

- Check for network issues:
 - Ensure the Studio Enterprise server is whitelisted.
 - To test whether the issue is related to the network, use Revu to connect to the Studio Enterprise server from another network.
- Check the Active Directory configuration. Verify that the external users are members of the domain. If not, ensure Mixed Mode Authentication is used so outside users can create accounts.
- Check for certificate issues.
 - If the certificate is self-signed, the end user will need to import certificate into Trusted Root Authority.
 - For more information, see the [Self Signed Certificates](#) section.
- Check the Revu client and server logs for errors.

Users Can Connect but Are Disconnected After Some Time

Problem

Users can connect to the Studio Enterprise server in Revu, but they are disconnected after a period of time.

Solution

Disable proxy re-authentication. Revu does not support proxy re-authentication. Ensure the following:

- Present proxies do not require re-authentication with the Revu client. Revu will not resend credentials re-authentication tokens.
- Revu is proxy aware if the proxy configuration is recognized as valid, but only on the initial login to Studio. Revu uses the proxy set up in the browser and will send those credentials, but it will only send the credentials that one time, or when a user reconnects manually.

Active Directory (AD) Integration Issues

LDAP Configuration Guidelines

Problem

Unable to successfully configure LDAP and AD integration configuration in the web portal.

Solutions

Try the following solutions:

- Reference the AD integration portions of the [Studio Enterprise Installation and Configuration Guide](#) for guidelines on AD integration.
- Verify the LDAP string is correct.
 - Try top-level domain before OUs or CNs to simplify the string. It's best to let LDAP point to the top-level domain (root domain).
 - Refer to these example strings:
 - LDAP://OU=users,DC=company,DC=local
 - LDAP://dc.company.local/
 - LDAP://domain-controller/dc=company,dc=local
 - The OU that contains the AD Users and SPN account should be children of the LDAP string location.
 - The LDAP string should include the OU where all the users who will be logging into Revu are located as a child.
 - Do not include AD groups in the LDAP string.
 - Verify users have not moved to a different OC or CN.

- Verify whether you are using the domain name or the name of the domain controller.
 - You can use the domain name in the connection string, as opposed to the name of a domain controller. The difference is that the domain name will resolve to the IP address of any domain controller in the domain, which can be both good and bad for the following reasons:
 - If using the name of the domain, you are not reliant on any single domain controller to run for the membership provider to work. However, if the name happens to resolve to a domain controller in a remote location with spotty network connectivity, you may have problems with the membership provider working.
 - If you use the name of domain controller and that domain controller goes down, no one will be able to connect.
 - When configuring the LDAP, you are only able to enter one DC (domain controller).
- You can find more guidance on LDAP Strings from [Microsoft](#).
- Verify SPN is configured correctly, credentials are valid, and the account can query all necessary fields.
 - It's best to ensure service account passwords are set to never expire.
 - Ensure that security principal is a member of the Local Administrators group on the Studio Enterprise server.
 - Security principal needs Read permission in Active Directory.
 - More information on setting up and troubleshooting the SPN can be found [below](#).
- Domain users must have an email address configured to be mapped properly. Check the [Mapping Issues](#) section for more info.
- Use the Active Directory Diagnostic Scripts to troubleshoot issues.
 - **Download Link:** <https://studio.bluebeam.com/share/drbrgr2>
 - **Password:** SEsupport123
 - The "domainconfigdiag" script will check your LDAP connection string, security principal credentials, and that Studio can query all the required fields for AD integration to work.
 - Instructions included in download.

Service Principal Name (SPN) Configuration Guidelines

Problem

- Unable to configure AD integration.
- Users are not being mapped from AD.
- AD users are unable to log in.
- Security Support Provider Interface (SSPI) authentication failed.
- No SPN is set to authenticate users when using AD and Windows Authentication.

Solution

For the service account to authenticate users seamlessly when Windows Authentication is used, it must be registered to the following SPN:

BLUEBEAM/studio

Reference the *SQL Authentication vs. Windows Authentication* section of the [Studio Enterprise Installation and Configuration Guide](#) for information about setting up the SPN.

- Use PowerShell to test if account is already set up in Active Directory.
 - Run following command in PowerShell: “setspn -q BLUEBEAM/studio -F”
 - If the account is in AD, the command should return “Existing SPN Found” and the name of the SPN.
 - If the account is not in AD, the command should return “Not Found”.
 - Ensure the service account used for SPN is a member of the Local Administrators group on the SE server.
 - Ensure the SPN account has a password that does not expire.
- Use PowerShell to set SPN in Active Directory.
 - Ensure the account you’re using for this task is a member of the Domain Admins group.
 - Run the following command in PowerShell, adjusting the command for the domain and the service account:
“setspn -S BLUEBEAM/studio DOMAIN\SERVICEACCOUNT”
- You can check which account is used as the SPN by logging into the Studio Enterprise portal in a web browser and looking under the AD Integration page. You may need to reset the Security Principal password.
 - Ensure the SPN exists in AD.
 - Determine if the password is expired. If so, you must reset the password.
- Use PowerShell to check for duplicate SPNs by running the following command:
“setspn -x”
- Use PowerShell to unregister SPN by running the following command:
“setspn -D BLUEBEAM/studio DOMAIN\SERVICEACCOUNT”

AD Group Requirements

Problem

AD groups are configured using the AD Group option in the AD Integration page of the Studio Enterprise web portal. If you chose to restrict Studio Enterprise accounts by AD group, reference the Solution section below to troubleshoot issues.

Note: *Using Groups can be inefficient when there are many AD objects. If you experience any AD query timeout issues, it's best not to use Groups.*

Solutions

Try the following solutions:

- Check the following AD Group Properties:
 - Security Group (Supported)
 - Distribution Groups (Not supported)
 - The Scope must be set to "Global"
- Users must be direct members of a Security group.
- The SPN must be a direct member of the Security group to authenticate group members.
- You cannot use default AD groups like "Domain Users".
- Users must have an email address configured.
- Not following these requirements may result in the following:
 - Users appear under **AD Manage Users > All Users** but cannot log in.
 - Existing studio users don't auto-map.
 - Users can't log in with Windows Authentication/AD Credentials.
- When making group member changes, you should not have to restart to see the changes or additions; the

changes should automatically appear. Ensure that these users are direct members of the AD group. If a user is in a subgroup of the AD group, they will not appear in the AD Manage Users Query and may not be able to log in.

- Ensure the user has a login name under both “User Logon Name” and “User Logon Name (pre-Windows 2000)” in AD.

Mapping Issues

Problem

Users are unable to log into the Studio Enterprise server from the Revu client. Certain AD users are not being mapped successfully. The AD user is not found on the AD Manage User page in the Studio Enterprise web portal.

Solutions

- Verify that all the required fields in AD contain data and can be queried. All these values are mandatory.

Required AD Fields that Studio queries = Display Name, Mail (email field), User Principal Name, SAM Account Name, GUID (not visible), SID (not visible)

- Are you using AD Groups in the AD Integration options (This can be found in the Studio Enterprise web portal)?
 - Login can be slow with lots of groups and potentially timeout.
 - Simplify this configuration if this is the case.
 - If using AD Groups, ensure users are members.
- Ensure the AD users are included as a child of the LDAP string.
 - Update the LDAP string to point at the top-level domain (root).
 - Try a few different tests, moving users to a different OU, creating new users, etc. to see if anything helps.
- Ensure the user is a member of Domain Users.
- If you have Windows Authentication enabled for the service account and can manually enter AD credentials but can't login with check box, the SPN may need to be investigated. Check the [SPN](#) section to troubleshoot the SPN configuration.
- Ensure the server you are connecting to is not one of our cloud servers (studio.bluebeam.com or bluebeamstudio.co.uk).

- After verifying all the above, select Auto-Map Users in the AD Integration tab of the Studio Enterprise web portal to map users.

Users Can No Longer Log in with AD Credentials

Problem

Users who were previously able to log in with AD credentials are no longer able to do so.

Solutions

- If you're using Mixed Mode Credentials, do regular Studio (non-AD) accounts work?
- Is the account password valid?
 - Check with a network administrator to ensure your AD account is active and the password is correct.
 - If unsure, reference the [Reset Studio Account Password](#) section.
- If the SPN password has changed, check the [SPN](#) section to troubleshoot the SPN configuration.
- Check logs from the Revu client and server.
- Verify the LDAP string. Refer to [LDAP Configuration Guidelines](#) for details.

Active Directory Error Messages in Logs

Problem

The main cause of the error below is the limitations of directory searches done on the Manage AD Users page within the Studio Portal.

ERROR - Bluebeam.Studio.AdminPortal.Core.DomainAccountRepository - System.Runtime.InteropServices.COMException (0x8007202C): The server does not support the requested critical extension.

Information on Issue

The issue is caused by the Directory Searcher components within the Microsoft libraries that Bluebeam leverages to search for users that exist under the configured LDAP path. The issue occurs when more than 2000 users are listed under the configured path, which is near the default cutoff for the maximum number of results that AD will return for any query. This is a Microsoft limitation, so we are unable to provide specific remediation steps, but [this](#) article details possible solutions.

WARNING: *We don't recommend increasing the search buffer size, because it could cause unforeseen performance issues for the AD infrastructure.*

Problem

The Security Principal is no longer valid, and the error below displays.

ERROR - Bluebeam.Studio.AdminPortal.Core.DomainAccountRepository - Please check that the configured Studio security principal is still valid. The principal may no longer exist, or the password may have expired.

Solution

In some cases, this error does not affect functionality and is triggered by the "DomainAccountRepository" error above. If this is not related to the "DomainAccountRepository" error and users are unable to connect with AD accounts, the SPN may be misconfigured. In this case check the above [SPN](#) section to troubleshoot the SPN configuration.

AD User is Not Found on The AD Manage User Page in Studio Portal

Problem

Certain AD users are not being mapped successfully. The AD user is not found on the AD Manage User page in the Studio portal.

Solutions

- Ensure the AD users are included as a child of the LDAP string.
- Ensure the user has an email address in their AD User Object.
- Try updating the LDAP string to point at the top-level domain (root)
- Check the [Mapping Issues](#) section for more details.

AD User Left the Company and was Rehired

Problem

If a user was deleted from AD, the user account is still active in the Studio Enterprise environment. If a user has been subsequently rehired and they need an account, they will need to remap it.

Solution

1. Log into the Studio Enterprise portal with an Administrator account.
2. Open the AD Manage Users window.
3. Find the user in question and select **Unmap User**.
4. Have the user try to log into Studio Enterprise again.

Note: If the user account in the AD Manage Users window doesn't have an email listed and the "Unmap User" option isn't available, go into the Studio Portal, locate the user account and click "Update Profile". This action may be required to refresh the user account and get it mapped, so we can perform the procedure and properly remap the account.

If this procedure doesn't resolve the issue, you can delete the user from the database directly.

WARNING: These SQL changes can possibility cause data loss or database corruption. An experienced DBA should be involved for any of these changes. Back up the database prior to making any changes.

- Execute the SQL query " delete from T_ActiveDirectoryUser where DomainEmail = 'user@company.com' "
- Refresh the web portal and try to remap the user.
- As a last resort, try to delete the user from the T_User table. When doing so, you will get errors from other tables that have database constraints against the user. You will need to go through and delete the user from every table that shows a constraint before you can finally delete the user from T_User table.

Reset Studio Enterprise to Studio Credentials Only

Problem

Studio Enterprise gets stuck in an AD configuration that is corrupted or no longer working.

Solution

You may need to force the configuration back to its default. To perform this action, you must run SQL scripts to change back to Studio Credentials Only.

This solution may also be useful for customers who can no longer log into the Portal because their LDAP settings are misconfigured, or they don't know the password for the administrator account.

Use the [Reset Studio Credentials Script](#) in this circumstance.

WARNING: Use this script as a last resort. This script will delete all AD configurations to unmap all users, configuration settings, and reset it to Studio credentials. If the users' email addresses have not changed, their Sessions will still be associated. Sessions are correlated by email address. After AD is re-integrated, users will get remapped as soon as they log in.

Unable to Log in with AD

Problem

Unable to log in with Active Directory and the log shows an Object Reference error when logging into Studio. 'System.ServiceModel.Diagnostics.TraceUtility' - 'AccountCreateResponseDto' Errors.

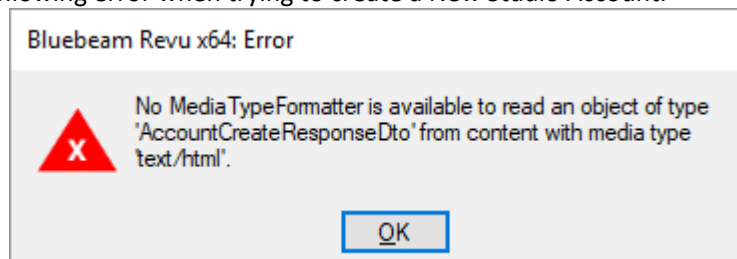
Receiving 'System.ServiceModel.Diagnostics.TraceUtility' errors. Finding errors in logs and event viewer related to .NET. Exception similar to the following:

System.TypeInitializationException: The type initializer for 'System.ServiceModel.Diagnostics.TraceUtility' threw an exception. ->

System.Configuration.ConfigurationErrorsException: Configuration system failed to initialize -> System.Configuration.ConfigurationErrorsException: The 'configuration' start tag on line 12 position 2 does not match the end tag of 'system.data'. Line 172, position 7. (C:\Windows\Microsoft.NET\Framework64\v4.0.30319\Config\machine.config line 172) ->

System.Xml.XmlException: The 'configuration' start tag on line 12 position 2 does not match the end tag of 'system.data'. Line 172, position 7.

You may also receive the following error when trying to create a New Studio Account.



Solutions

These issues are related to an unhealthy .NET state on the Studio Enterprise server.

- Use a [.NET repair tool](#) to find issues with .NET on the Studio Enterprise server that can be repaired.
- If repairs do not help, .NET may need to be reinstalled.
 - a. Uninstall Studio Enterprise.
 - b. Use the Server Manager on the Application server to remove .NET:
 - i. Remove Roles and Features on the web server — Select the version of .NET to uninstall.
 - ii. Restart the server.

WARNING: This leaves the Server core installed without a GUI. Only the Admin CMD Prompt is available.
 - c. Reinstall the GUI — <https://social.technet.microsoft.com/wiki/contents/articles/51720.windows-server-troubleshooting-procedure-to-recover-gui.aspx>.
 - d. Use the Server Manage to re-install .NET:
 - i. Add Roles and Features - Select the version of .NET to install.
 - ii. Restart the server.
 - e. Reinstall Studio Enterprise.

“Please map at least one studio admin account to a domain user that exists...”

Problem

You received the *“Please map at least one studio admin account to a domain user that exists under [LDAP String] to avoid a system logout”* error when setting up Active Directory integration.

Solution

This error is related to setting up with Active Directory Credentials Only. We recommend initially setting up this configuration with Mixed Mode Credentials. Doing so allows you to test the AD integration after you set it up and verify everything works as desired. If AD integration is initially set to Credentials Only, you risk not being able to access the portal with your current non-AD Studio Administrator Account.

Set up integration with Mixed Mode Credentials and set some of the users mapped from AD as Administrators in the portal. With Mixed Mode on, perform the following steps:

1. Go to the Users panel and select the AD users you want to make a Portal Administrator.
2. Under **User Role**, select the **Administrator**.
3. Select **Update profile**.

We also recommend setting a few accounts to have the Administrator value to ensure there is a backup if you lose credentials for the main admin account.

Certificate Issues

Certificate Change

Information about certificates can be found in the [Studio Enterprise Installation and Configuration Guide](#). When you obtain the replacement certificate, it must be installed in the Personal Store at the local machine level on the Studio Enterprise server.

After the certificate is installed in the Personal Store, follow these steps to change the certificate:

1. Open the Bluebeam Studio Enterprise Administrator on the Studio Enterprise server.
2. In the **Status** tab, ensure the hostname matches the name on the certificate.
3. Select the **Certificate Configuration** tab on the left.
4. Select **Change Certificate** and select the new certificate.
5. Select **OK**.
6. Select **Apply**.
7. When prompted to restart services, select **Yes** to restart Studio Enterprise Services and apply certificate changes.
8. In most cases you will also need to change the certificate in IIS (Internet Information Services) to ensure you can connect to the web portal. Open IIS on the Studio Enterprise server.
9. Find the Bluebeam Studio Server site. Right-click and select **Edit Bindings**.
10. Select the https binding and select **Edit**.
11. Change the SSL certificate to the new certificate being used by the Studio Enterprise server.
12. Select **OK**.
***Note:** If you are unable to connect to the web portal after the SSL change, you may need to ensure that the IP address is assigned in the https bindings.*
13. Press **OK**.
14. As an administrator, use the following command line to restart IIS on the Studio Enterprise server:
iisreset /restart
15. Test connectivity to the Studio Enterprise server via both Revu and a web browser.

WARNING: Performing these actions will result in the loss of connectivity for active users. If this is a concern, schedule downtime to perform the certificate change.

Can't Log in, Can't Access Portal, and https://localhost Fails to Load Anything

Problem

Users are unable to access the Studio Enterprise server from the Revu client, they can't access Studio Enterprise portal from a web browser, and https://localhost fails to load on the Studio Enterprise server.

Solution

Check the following:

- Check Certificate Bindings in IIS.
 1. Open IIS.
 2. Select **Bluebeam Studio Server**.
 3. Select **Bindings....**
 4. Ensure **Site Binding** is set for port 443.
 5. Ensure the IP address is assigned.
 6. Ensure the SSL certificate matches the certificate used in Bluebeam Studio Administrator.
 7. As an administrator, use the following command line to restart IIS on the Studio Enterprise server:
iisreset /restart
- The certificate may need to be changed if it is invalid. If you need to change the certificate, see the [Certificate Change](#) section.

- IIS may be corrupt. If the solutions above don't help, try the following:
 1. Uninstall Studio Enterprise,
 2. Uninstall IIS components from Server Manager.
 3. Reboot the server.
 4. Re-install (reselect) IIS components from Server Manager
WARNING: Do not select WebDAV.
 5. Re-install Studio Enterprise.

Self-Signed Certificate

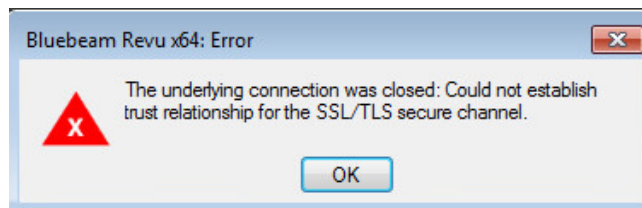
Problem

Users are unable to connect to Studio Enterprise. A certificate error appears, or the certificate shown when the portal is used is invalid. If there is an issue with the certificate, the Revu client log would show errors like this:

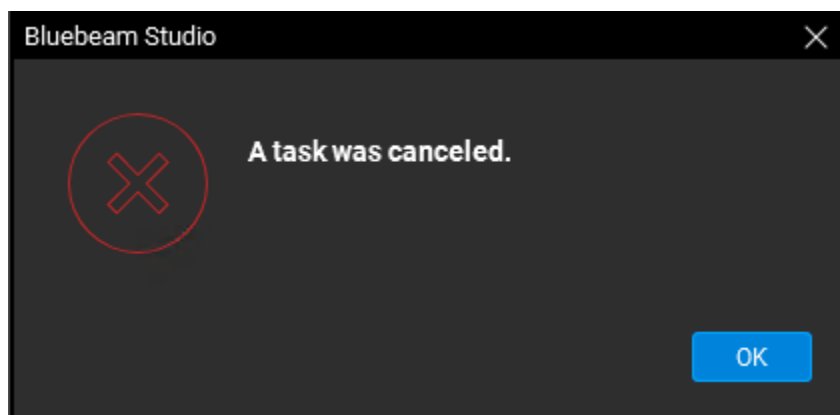
Unable to retrieve discovery information for the server.

The underlying connection was closed: Could not establish trust relationship for the SSL/TLS secure channel.

System.Net.WebException: The underlying connection was closed: Could not establish trust relationship for the SSL/TLS secure channel. ---> System.Security.Authentication.AuthenticationException: The remote certificate is invalid according to the validation procedure.



The issue could also result in the following error message:
A task was canceled.



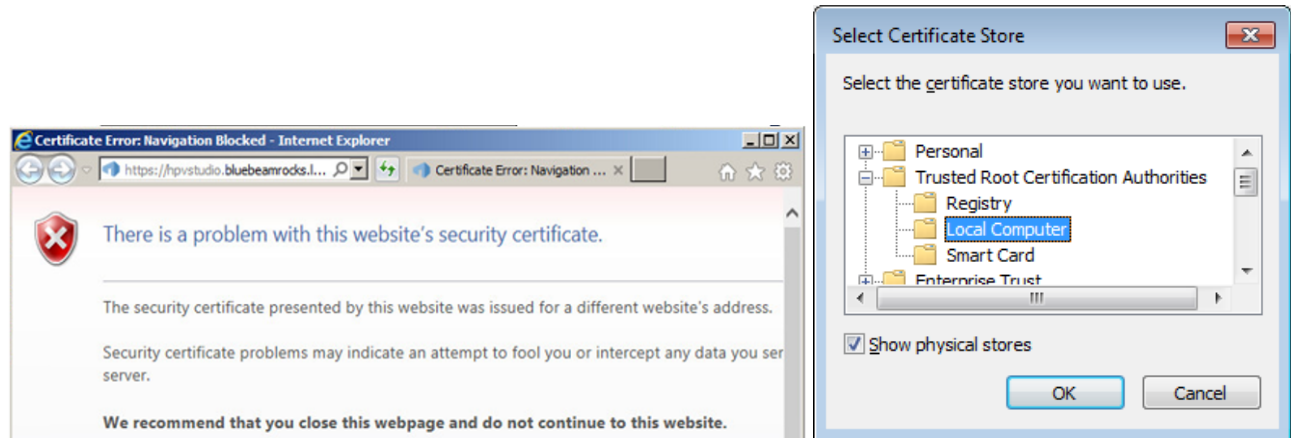
Solution

The problem is most likely that the self-signed certificate Studio Enterprise is using, is not installed on the end user's computer. As a result, Revu won't connect due to security errors that should appear in the Revu logs.

- The first thing to check is that you do not use http:\\ when entering the server name into Revu, because this can

cause an issue.

- Next, open your web browser and visit the Studio web page (<https://servername>). When the certificate error appears:
 1. Choose to view the error.
 2. When prompted, choose to install the certificate.
 3. In the Select Certificate Store dialog, place the certificate in the Local Computer folder under Trusted Root Certification Authorities.
 4. Select **Show physical stores**.This will ensure that the certificate is trusted for all users on the computer.



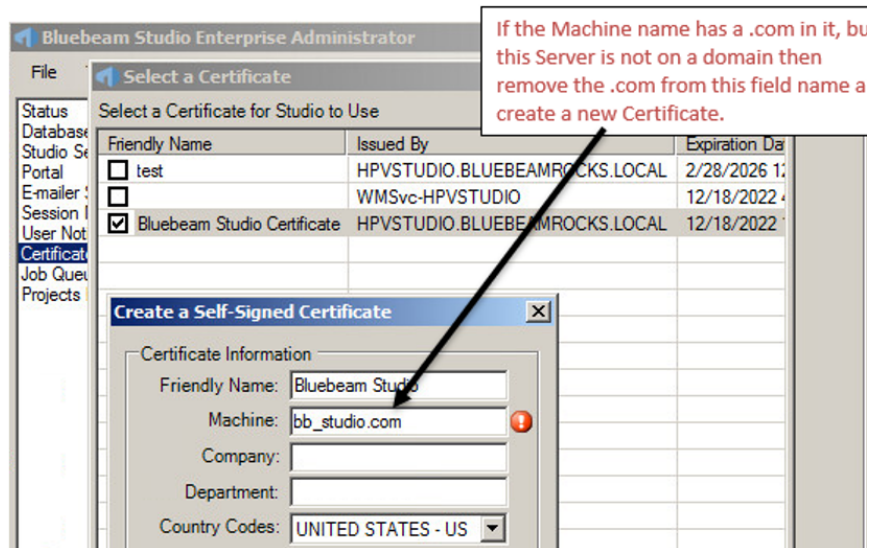
An SSL belonging to a Trusted Root Certification Authority (CA), would automatically authenticate a user when the Revu client connects to the server, so you may be using a self-signed certificate since it needs to be installed. Check to see if the name on the certificate matches the machine name, which should match the host name in the Studio Administrator. This is what you'd need to use as the URL in Revu if there is a discrepancy anywhere Revu would fail to connect with security errors. Some more details on Certificate naming can be found below.

Certificate naming:

The self-signed certificate name must match the hostname of the Studio server. In the Studio Administrator, click **Status** and verify the hostname matches the certificate name.

If the Studio server is not on a domain, but the certificate was issued by a domain address, remove the domain and recreate the certificate.

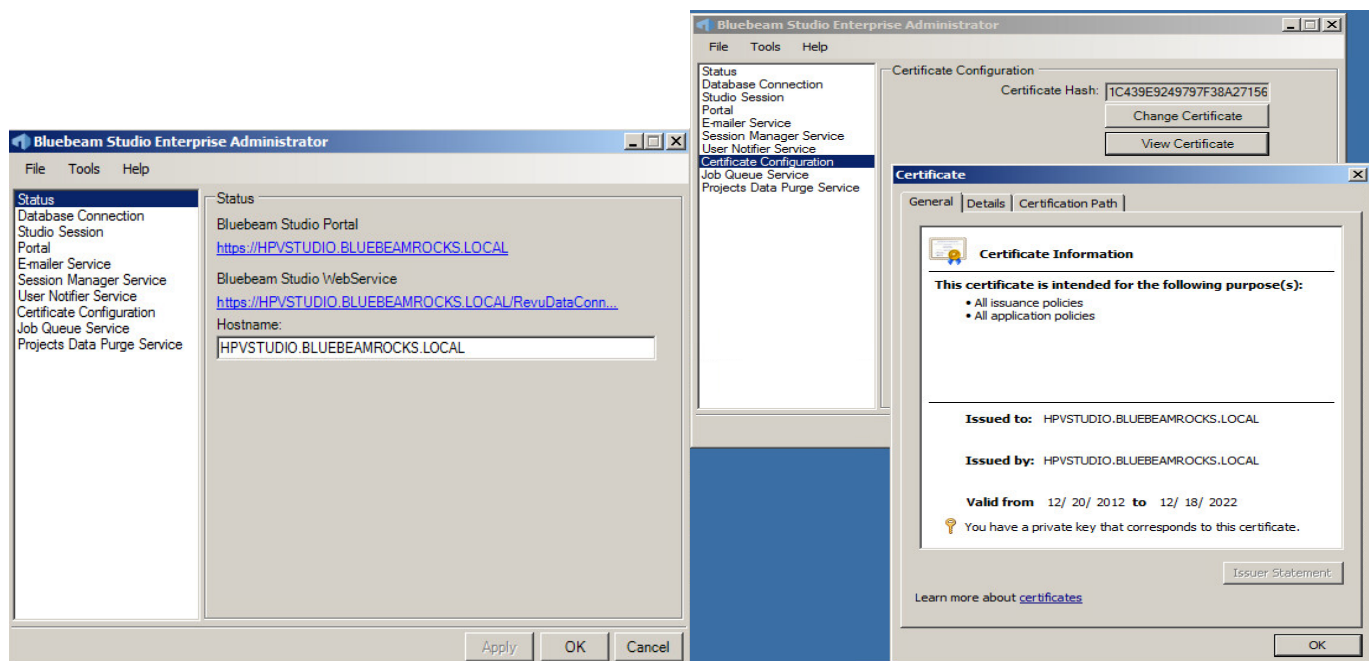
Note: The certificate name must match the server hostname:



If the name in the Machine field includes “.com”, but this server is not on a domain, remove “.com” from this field and create a new certificate.

Hostname: EXAMPLE.DOMAIN.LOCAL

iPad Users Can't Connect

Problem

Revu for iPad users can't connect to the Studio Enterprise server, but Revu for Windows machines can.

Solution

Studio Portal Issues

Change Password Tab Missing from Studio Portal for Some Users

Problem

The Change Password tab is missing from Studio Portal for some users.

Solution

We hide the Change Password tab for users created via AD. If a user logs in via Revu for the first time using their AD credentials, a Studio user with no password is created and cannot be changed. We do the same thing for Studio users who are mapped to AD accounts. AD users must change their passwords via AD.

Error: "Enter a valid host name" Appears When Attempting to Open Studio Enterprise Portal in Web Browser

Problem

The error, "Enter a valid host name" appears when attempting to open the Studio Enterprise portal in a web browser.

Solution

This issue is a result of using an underscore character in the server hostname while configuring the server. To resolve the issue, remove the underscore character from the server hostname and all references to it. Compare the machine name, hostname in the Studio Enterprise Administrator, certificate, and URL in IIS to verify they do not include the character.

Establishing a New Studio Administrator if the Original Administrator Password is Lost

Problem

You're unable to log into the Studio Enterprise portal as an administrator. This issue could be the result of an administrator leaving the company with no back up administrator or the administrator losing their password.

Solution

If you have a user with administrator access, you can assign the administrator role another user. For more information, see the [User Administration and Reporting](#) section of this document. If the administrator has lost their password, see the [Reset Password](#) section of this document for more information.

If using AD Credentials Only, you may need to reset the credential type to Studio Accounts to allow you access. See the [Reset Studio Enterprise to Studio Credentials Only](#) section for further details. In most circumstances, we recommend working with IT to gain access to the AD account that previously had Studio Enterprise portal administrator permissions and logging in with those credentials.

If no users have administrator permissions to the Studio Portal, you'll need to edit a user directly in the database and grant them access.

1. Use a current, non-AD Studio account or create a new Studio account that is not mapped to AD. This account will be granted administrator rights. Use the Revu login dialog, and reference the [Creating User Accounts](#) section for steps to create an account.
2. Log into the Portal with that user's Studio account.
3. With the help of a database administrator, run the following command on the BluebeamStudio database:

GO

DECLARE @myEmail nvarchar(max) = 'sample@email.com'; --Enter email address here. Replace
'sample@email.com'

DECLARE @myUserID INT

PRINT CONCAT('Email: ', @myEmail)
PRINT CONCAT('UserID: ', @myUserID)

UPDATE T_User
SET UserStatus=0, ServerAccess='True'
WHERE Email=@myEmail

if exists(SELECT * from T_UserRole where UserID=@myUserID)
BEGIN
    update T_UserRole set RoleID=1 where UserID=@myUserID
End
else
begin
insert into T_UserRole values(1, @myUserID)
end

4. Update the email address on line 5 with the email address for the account that needs to be an administrator.
5. After running the script, log into the portal to verify administrator access was granted.

Studio Sessions Markups are Not Updating in Real Time

Problem

Multiple users are connected to a Studio Session. Each user can only see updates to markups they place but not markups of other users.

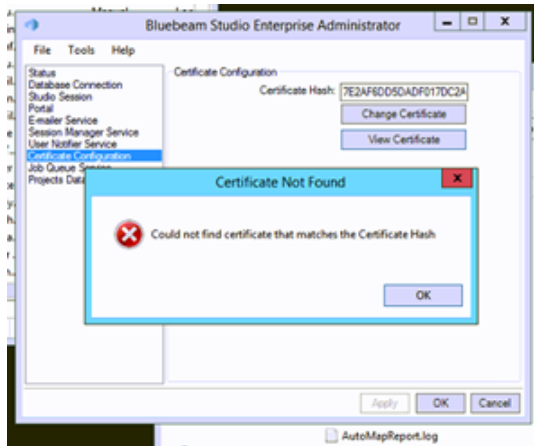
Error Sample (multiple instances of the same error found in StudioServer.log, located in C:\Users\WindowsUserAccount\AppData\Local\Temp\Bluebeam Software):
"System.Exception: Certificate Error. Could not find the certificate with the hash string:"

Solutions

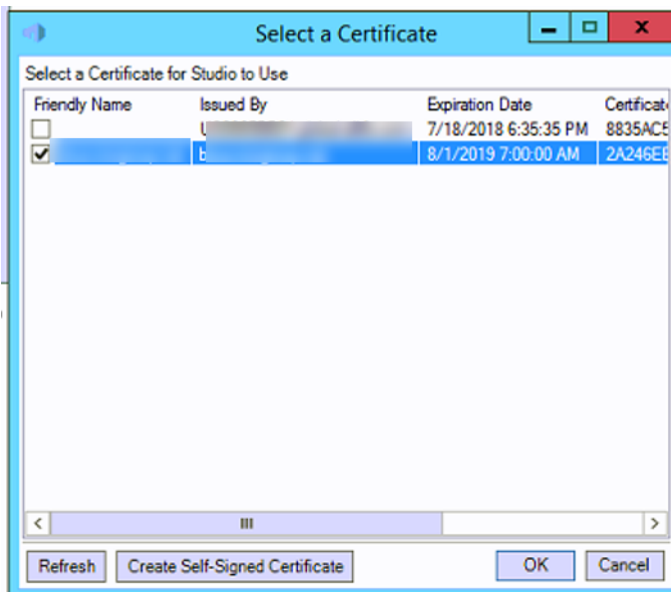
Try the following solutions:

1. Launch the Studio Enterprise Administrator on the application server.
2. Go to Certificate Configuration.
3. Click **View Certificate**

Note: In some instances, Studio Enterprise Administrator will not indicate a problem with the certificate, but the issue is present. In other instances, the message "Certificate Not Found" appears.



4. Select **Change Certificate**.
5. If more than one certificate is listed, determine the correct one (the one with the latest dates, etc.), and ensure the check box is selected as shown below.



6. Select **OK**.
 7. Restart the Studio Enterprise instance by selecting **Administrator > Tools > Restart Server**.
 8. In most cases, you should also reboot the web server.
 - a. Log into the web server as an administrator.
 - b. Use the command line to enter the following command:
iisreset /restart
- Note:** This action should be performed during a maintenance window (with no users connected to Studio).
9. When services are back online, perform tests to verify the issues are no longer present.

If this solution does not resolve the issue, try clearing the Session cache as described in [Clearing Revu Client Session Cache](#).

Studio Web Portal Prompts Users to select a Client Certificate

Problem

The Studio web portal prompts users to select a client certificate.

Solution

This issue is related to the IIS configuration. To prevent this prompt:

1. Open IIS on the Studio Enterprise server.
2. Select the Bluebeam Studio site and double-click **SSL Settings**.
3. Deselect **Require**
4. Set Client Certificates to Ignore.
5. Apply the settings.

Perform an IISRESET after this change.

Profile Information is Blank in Studio Portal

Problem

If the user's profile information is blank in the Studio web portal, the issue is likely related to an issue with their email address. If a Studio account was created with an email address containing an apostrophe or another invalid character, their user profile may show up blank in the web portal.

Solution

You can use Studio Enterprise with an email address that includes an apostrophe, but administering the account through the portal will not work as expected. We highly recommend not using email addresses that include apostrophes or other special characters.

If you do use an email of this type and you need to access the functionality in the portal for the user, ask your DBA for help to remove the apostrophe from user's email value in the T_User table of the database. You can then access the user in the Studio Enterprise portal and make the needed changes. After you make the changes in the Studio Enterprise portal, the DBA can revert the email address in the T_User table back, after which the user will once again display the blank information in the portal.

User is Connected to the Wrong Session/Project

Problem

A user logs into Studio and selects a Session or Project ID in the Revu Studio panel, but the user is connected to a different Session or Project ID.

Solution

Making a profile change causes the Studio database to rebuild the users Profile and usually fixes the above issue.

1. Log into the Studio Portal as an administrator and find the user's profile.
2. Make any change to their profile, such as a change to their User Role, and select **Update Profile**.
3. Revert the change and select **Update Profile** again.
4. Ask the user to try connecting to their Session or Project and verify they are connected to the proper Session/Project ID.

If this procedure doesn't resolve the issue, check if the Technician Role is selected in the user's profile. If so, deselect the Technician Role for the user and select **Update Profile**.

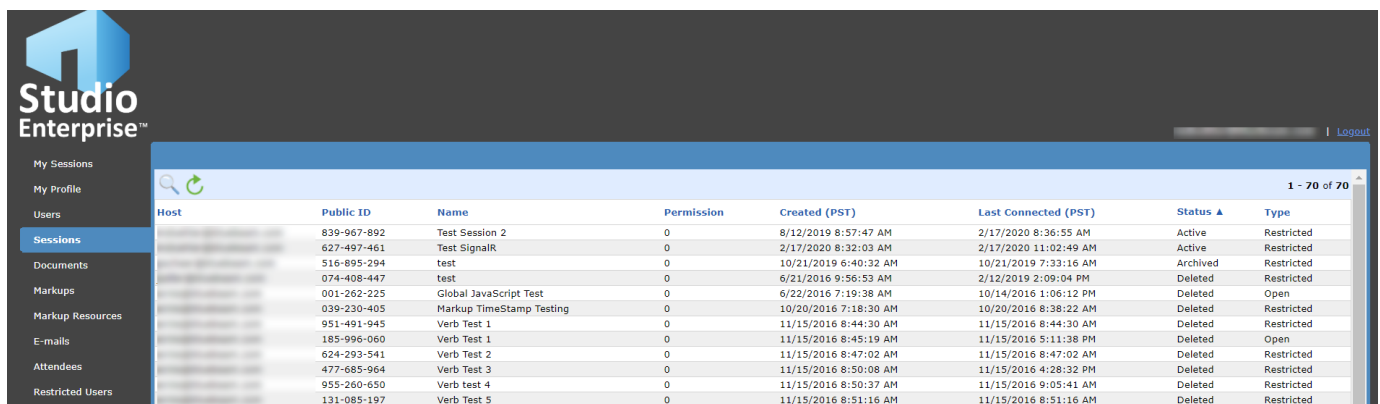
Note: Users with the Technical Role selected in their profiles can join Sessions they are not invited to. However, they are not able to access Session files.

Administrator Tasks

How to Use the Session Status and Properties Panel in the Web Portal

If your user account has the Administrator role, you can use the web portal to perform administrative tasks on the Studio Enterprise server.

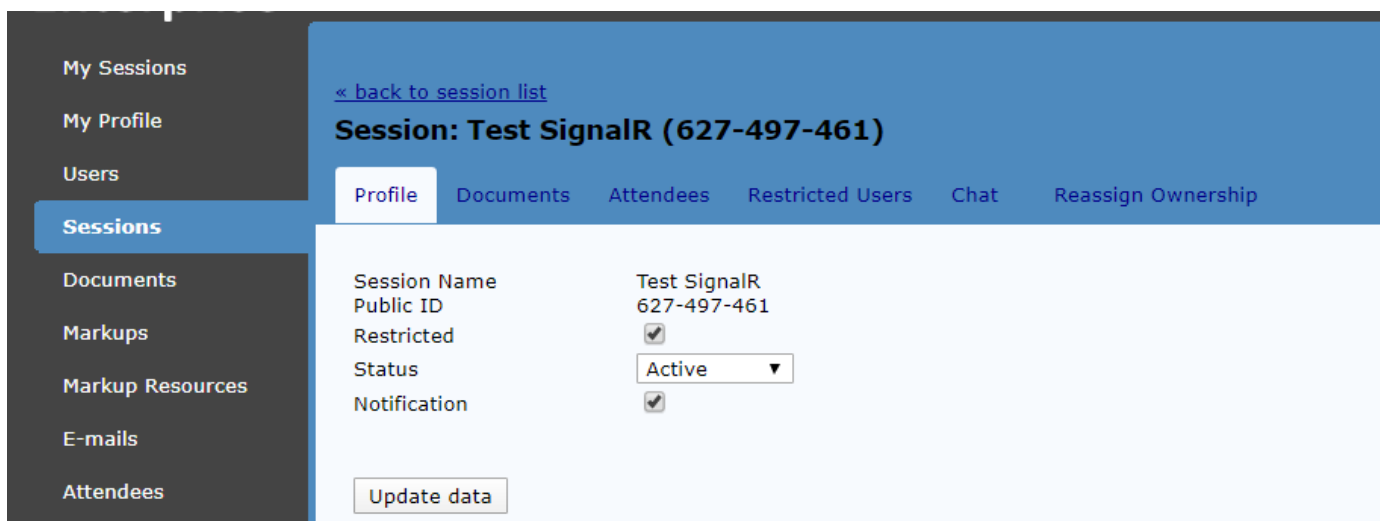

From the Sessions page, you can search through the Sessions to find any that meet your criteria or sort by a specific column. In the above image you can see the Sessions are being sorted by Status.

If you select a Session, you can access several tabs with potentially useful information about the Session. If you wish to change the Status of a Session, select the new Status in the Profile tab and select **Update data**. We recommend that you download any documents you might need from a Session prior to changing the Status to anything other than "Active".

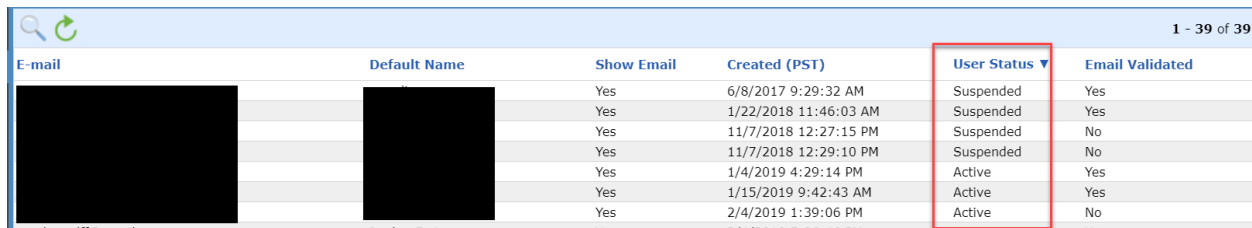

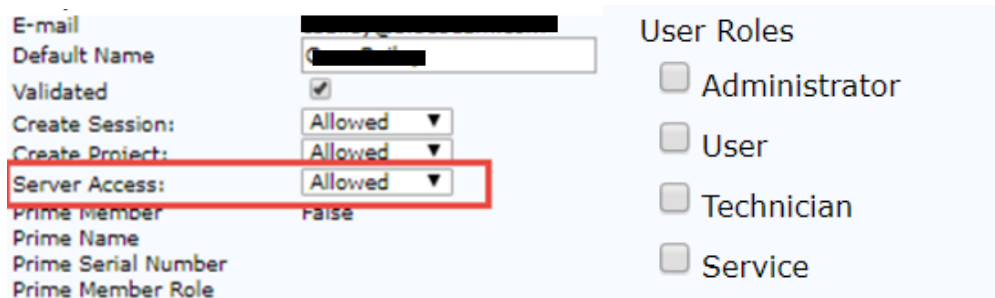

3. View the User Status column to verify if the user is Suspended.

Users with the Administrator role have access to Administer the server via the web portal. [The Studio Enterprise Install and Config Guide](#) details the different role behaviors. Only Administrators will have access to all the control options in the portal. All other users will only have access to the My Sessions and My Profile Tabs.

There is no reporting feature for the user list, though you can select them all and copy them into an excel sheet. This will just take some formatting.

Suspended Account – Reference if you wish to Delete or Remove a User

There is no official/supported/recommended way to delete a user from Studio Enterprise. If a user needs to be removed, instead set Server Access to **Restricted** as detailed above. Reactivate Project

Use the following procedure to reactivate deleted Projects through the Studio Portal:

1. Enter your company's Studio Enterprise server into a browser
Example: [https://bluebeam.\[company\].com](https://bluebeam.[company].com)
2. Sign in with a Studio account with Administrator permissions.
3. Search for the Project or Project item you want to reactivate.
4. In the left navigation select **Project Undelete**.

Restricting Domains / Restricting User Permissions

You can use the Server Permissions page in the Studio Enterprise portal to restrict access to your Studio Enterprise server in the Studio Enterprise portal. These configuration details can be found in the [Studio Enterprise Installation and Configuration Guide](#).

The method described below only allows you to deny specific domains, but it will not allow you to deny all domains other than the ones you allow. For example, if you specify both @domain1.com and @domain2.com as allowed domains, all other domains would still be accessible. There is no way to use a wildcard to deny all possible domains, instead any domain you want to deny will be allowed until it is entered here.

Furthermore, if you set the Studio Users Default to Deny, but have a Domain set to Allow, that domain will still have new accounts created with Deny permissions, as it will take the most restrictive permissions. Here is an image depicting this setting.

If “Studio Users Default” is set to “Deny”, anyone who creates a new account will have their values set to “Deny”. If you do not have many new users, this may be a path forward. You could restrict the whole server and then you will need to manually approve new users’ access. With this configuration, you would then go to the “Users” panel and change their access from “Restricted” to “Allowed”.

SQL Server Issues

Database Install Fails

Problem

Database creation fails during Studio Enterprise installation.

Solution

Check the following:

- Check permissions on the Setup account. Ensure the service account has the following required permissions:
 - dbcreator – to create and configure the database
 - securityadmin (during creation only) – to configure the service account to run stored procedures and gain access to the database
 - serveradmin
 - DatabaseMailUserRole
 - Ensure Service Accounts are members of local Administrator group.
 - More information can be found in the [Studio Enterprise Install and Configuration Guide](#).
- Check Install Logs.
 - C:\Users\[account]\AppData\Local\Temp – Look for logs starting with “Bluebeam_Studio_”.
 - If you see errors related to “Failed to verify signature of payload” and “Failed authenticode verification of payload”, verify the certificate is trusted.
- If installing SQL 2016, SQL 2019, or SQL 2022, ensure you use the Studio Enterprise 3.2 build. For more information, see [How to upgrade to Studio Enterprise 3.2](#).

SQL Server Migration

When migrating to a new SQL server, your DBA must be involved and guiding most of the process. Your DBA will be able to perform most of the migration in line with their regular process, combined with our general best practices and recommendations, as seen in [How to upgrade to Studio Enterprise 3.2](#).

SQL Queries

Check Fragmentation Script

Keep fragmentation below 15% if possible. The script below can help verify the fragmentation on important indexes. With that information, you can change the maintenance routine as needed.

Active Connections Script

Note: If you're using Studio Enterprise 3.2, you don't need this script. The performance patch is built in and allows for 1024 connections.

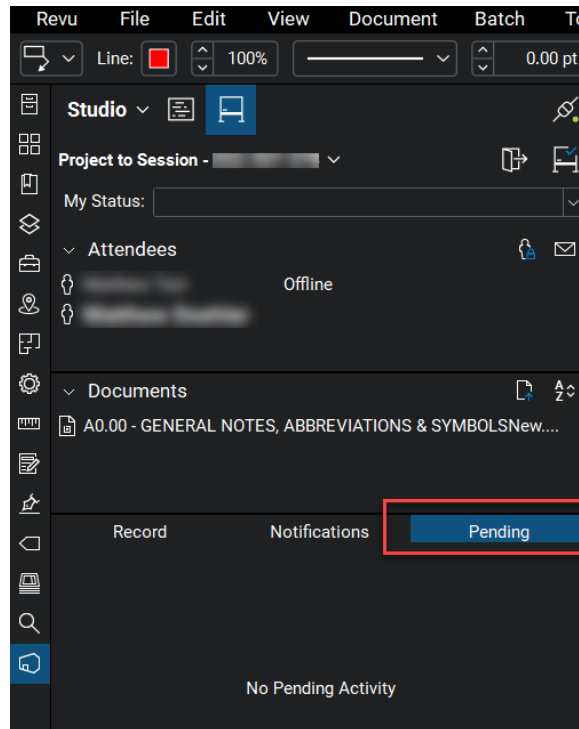

Revu Client Issues

Clearing Revu Client Session Cache

Several circumstances exist in which a user's Session cache may become corrupted and need to be cleared. Use the steps below to clear the Session cache.

Within Revu, access the Session in question and click the Pending tab to view any markups. If you see pending markups, make sure your internet connection is online, so you can upload the markups.



If the Pending tab is empty, log out of Studio and go to the following path on your computer, depending on your version:

Session Cache:

%localappdata%\Bluebeam\Sessions (v2017)

%localappdata%\Revu\2018\Sessions (v2018)

%localappdata%\Revu\data\Sessions (v2019 and above)

Once you're there:

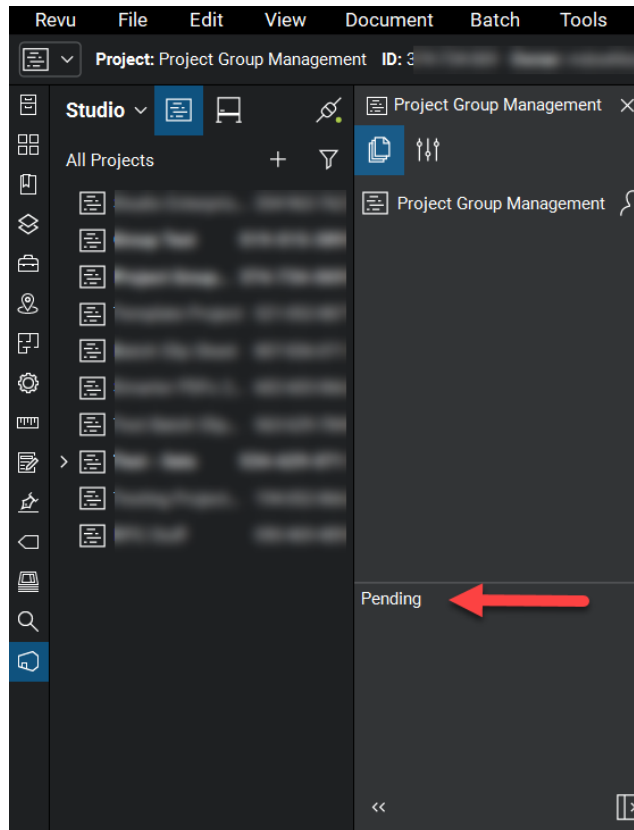
1. Go to the folder that bears the Studio Enterprise server name (if your Session is currently in studio.bluebeam.com, go to that folder).
2. Rename the folder that shows the Session ID in question (You can enter "old" at the end of the new folder name).
3. Restart Revu.
4. Log back into Studio.
5. Return to the Session in question and see if the issue is resolved.

Note: Once you log back into the Session, this cached folder is recreated with the data from the Session hosted on the Studio server.

Clearing Revu Client Project Cache

Several circumstances may cause a user's Project cache to become corrupted and need to be cleared. Below are steps on how to accomplish this.

In Revu, go to the Project in question and confirm you have no files currently checked out.



If no files are checked out, log out of Studio and go to the following path on your computer, depending on your version:

%localappdata%\Bluebeam (If using Revu 2015-2017)

%localappdata%\Revu (If using Revu 2018)

%localappdata%\Revu\data\ (If using Revu 2019 and above)

Once you're there:

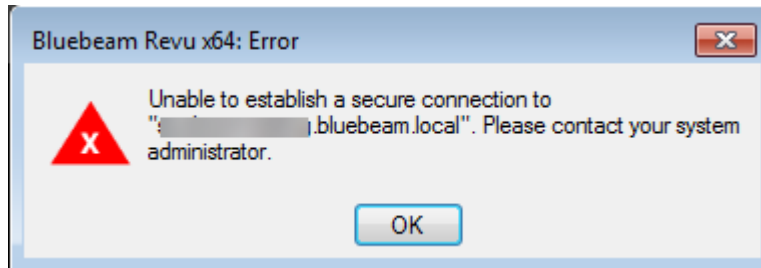
1. Find a folder named the same as the Project ID (xxx-xxx-xxx).
Note: Because it's on a Studio Enterprise server, the location is not standard. Search this location for a folder of that name or go into each "OX" folder until you find it.
2. Rename the folder that shows the Project ID in question (You can enter "old" at the end of the new folder name).
3. Within Revu, log back into Studio.
4. Go into the Project in question to verify the issue is resolved.

Note: When you log back into the Project, this cached folder is recreated with the data from the Project hosted on the Studio Server

"Unable to establish a secure connection" error when logging in

Problem

When attempting to log into Studio Enterprise through Revu, users receive an error stating "Unable to establish a secure connection to 'YourStudioURL'".



Solution

Use this [support article](#) to resolve issue.

Trouble Logging in (User)

Problem

User unable to successfully log into the Studio Enterprise server from the Revu client.

Solution

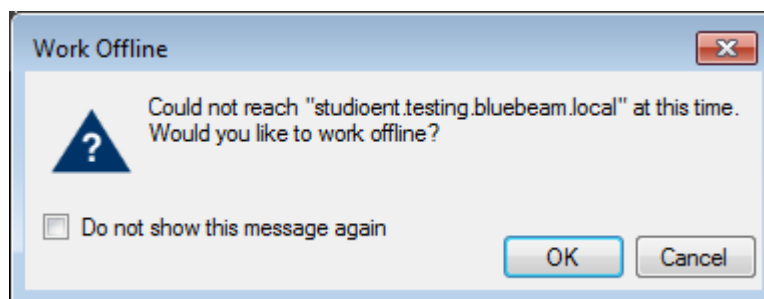
Check the following:

- Confirm that the Studio Enterprise server name is correct.
- If your company uses Active Directory to connect to Studio Enterprise, be sure that the domain/email is correct. If your company doesn't use Active Directory, enter the email address that's associated with the user's Studio account.
- If the user still cannot get in, select "Use Windows Authentication" and try logging in that way.
- Try logging into Studio Enterprise server via a browser:
 - **Example:** <https://bluebeam.company.com>
 - If the user can log in here, this will help validate that your credentials are correct.
- Check Revu client logs on the user's machine, look for errors in the revu.log.
- If the problem persists, an admin should check the Studio Portal to ensure the user's Studio account is set up properly on the back end. For more information, see the [User Administration and Reporting](#) section.
- The user's account password may need to be reset. For more information, see the [Reset/Change Studio Account Password](#) section.

Login Error: "Could not reach 'YourStudioURL' at this time. Would you like to work offline?"

Problem

When attempting to log into Studio Enterprise through Revu, users receive an error stating, could not reach "YourStudioURL" at this time. Would you like to work offline?"



Solution

Please use this [support article](#) to resolve issue.

Can't Finalize Session

Problem

Users are unable to finalize a Session.

Solution

Check the following:

- If the user is running Revu 2015, update to a newer version.
- Check the [logs for the end users' Revu clients](#).
- Have the Session or Project owner ensure the end user has the needed permissions to perform the action.
- Can the user "Save As" or generate a Session Report?
- Test the process on a different user's system to verify the issue is related to this specific Revu instance.
- Clear local [Session](#) cache (backup folders if there are changes that haven't been uploaded) and try again.
- Test the issue with a different Studio account to verify the issue is related to the account.
- Check [Event Viewer & Studio Logs on Studio Enterprise Server](#).

Can't Upload or Download Files to or from Sessions/Projects

Problem

A user is unable to upload or download files to or from a Project and/or Session.

Solution

Check the following:

- Check the [logs for the end user's Revu client](#).
- Test the process on a different user's system to verify the issue is related to this specific Revu instance.
- Clear the local [Session](#) and/or [Project](#) cache (back up folders if you have changes that haven't been uploaded) and try again.
- Test with a different Studio account to verify the issue is related to the account.
- Have the Session or Project owner ensure the end user has the needed permissions to perform action.
- Check the [Event Viewer and Studio Logs on the Studio Enterprise server](#).
- Determine if the Studio Enterprise server or the SQL server is out of disk space.
- Ensure the database is not full and is set to auto-expand.

Can't Go Offline with Studio Enterprise

Problem

Users are unable to go into Offline mode while using Studio Enterprise.

Solution

The issue could be a case sensitivity issue with the user's email address.

1. Ensure the user has no pending Session markups, or they will be lost, then close Revu.
2. Open the following location in File Explorer:
%appdata%\Bluebeam Software\Revu\[year]
3. Rename the UserSettings.xml file.

4. Reset settings in Revu.
 - Instructions on how to reset settings will change depending on Revu version. See this [support article](#) for the procedure.
 - The reset settings option in Revu resets your settings to their original configurations.
Note: *Before proceeding, we recommend you back up your settings in case this reset doesn't produced the desired result.*
5. Reopen Revu and log into Studio again.

Error: "A validated e-mail address is required to login..."

Problem

The following message appears when trying to log into a Studio Project or Session:

"A validated e-mail address is required to login. A new validation e-mail has been sent."

Solution

Session Files in Studio Enterprise Fail to Download with Revu 2017.0.20

Problem

Users in organizations running Bluebeam Studio Enterprise are unable to download files from Studio Sessions with Revu 2017.0.20.

Solution

Studio Session documents may not download successfully when using Revu/Vu version 2017.0.20 on Studio Enterprise. To resolve this issue update Revu to 2017.0.40 or newer. This issue is specific to 2017.0.20.

Time Stamp Difference

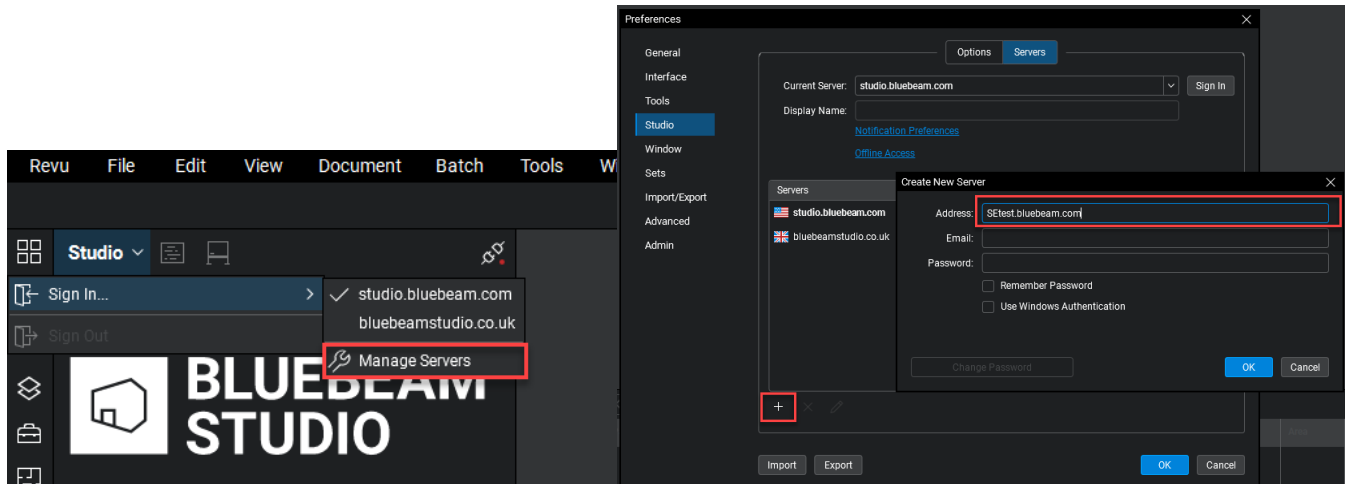
When working in Sessions/Projects you may see different time stamps, which may be confusing if the Session/Project includes users in different time zones. Time stamps for markups are adjusted to reflect the time zone for each user's Revu client. For example, a user in California will see a timestamp in Pacific Time for the markup left by a user in New York. However, reports will always reflect the time zone of the person who created the report.

In relation to the time stamps found in the Studio Portal, these will be based on the time zone in which the Studio Enterprise server is using.

How To...

Add a Studio Enterprise Server to Revu

1. In the Revu Studio tab, click the **Studio** drop-down and select **Sign In... > Manage Servers**.
2. In the Preferences dialog, select **Studio**.
3. Select the Servers tab.
4. Select the “+” icon and add the Studio Enterprise Hostname.
5. Select **OK**.



Create User Accounts

To create an account on a server:

1. From the Revu Studio tab, click the **Studio** drop-down and select **Sign In**.
2. Select the Studio Enterprise Server in question.
3. In the Sign in window, select Create Account and provide your email and password.
4. Select **OK**.

Change Display (Default) Name

2. in the left navigation, select **My Profile**.
3. Select the **User Data** tab.
4. Type a new **Default Name**.
5. Select **Update profile**.

Note: The new default name won't appear in your existing Studio Sessions or Projects. However, the default name will appear in any new Sessions or Projects you join. The change will take effect after you sign out of the Studio Enterprise application server and sign in again.

Reset/Change Studio Account Password

If you want to reset the password for a Studio Enterprise account:

1. From the Revu Studio tab, click the **Studio** dropdown and select **Sign In**.
2. Select the Studio Enterprise Server in question.
3. Enter your email address.
4. Select Lost Password.

You should then receive a password reset email.

You can also change your Studio account password by opening a browser and entering the URL for your company Studio Enterprise server.

Example: https://bluebeam.company.com

1. Sign in using your Studio account login information.
2. In the left navigation, select **My Profile**.
3. Select the **Change Password** tab.
4. Update your password.
5. Select Change.

If you don't see the **Change Password** tab, you are likely using an AD account. See the [Change Password Tab Missing from Studio Portal for Some Users](#) section in this document for more information.

If that does not help, determine whether you have AD integration with your Studio Enterprise server. If so, try to log in both by checking the Windows Authentication box and without doing so. You can also try typing your "domain\username". If you still experience issues logging in, you may need to reset your AD account password.

Restoring Sessions

In most cases, you can restore a Session that hasn't been purged from the database.

You can restore a Session password by opening a browser and entering the URL for your company Studio Enterprise server.

Example: <https://bluebeam.company.com>

Sign in using your Studio account login information.

If you are the host of the Session, follow these steps:

1. In the left navigation, select **My Sessions**.
2. Select the Session you want to restore.
3. Use the Status dropdown to select **Active**.
4. Select **Update data**.
5. Return to Revu to log out and log back into Studio.

The Session should appear in your list again.

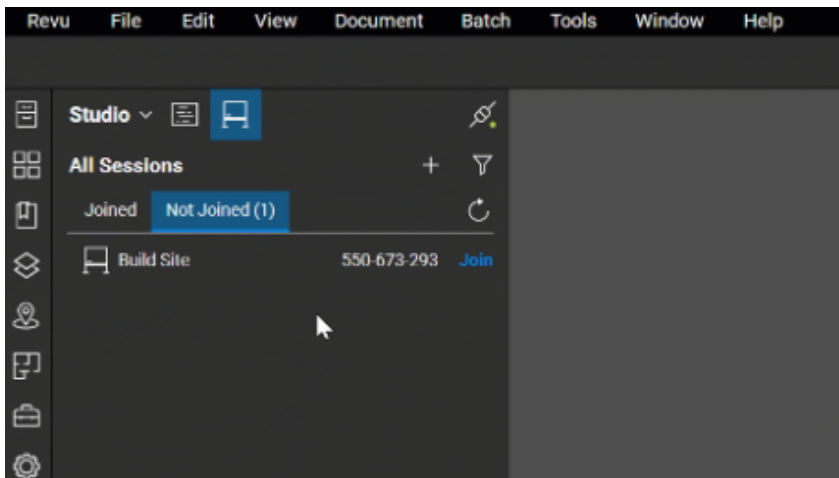

Incompatible Features

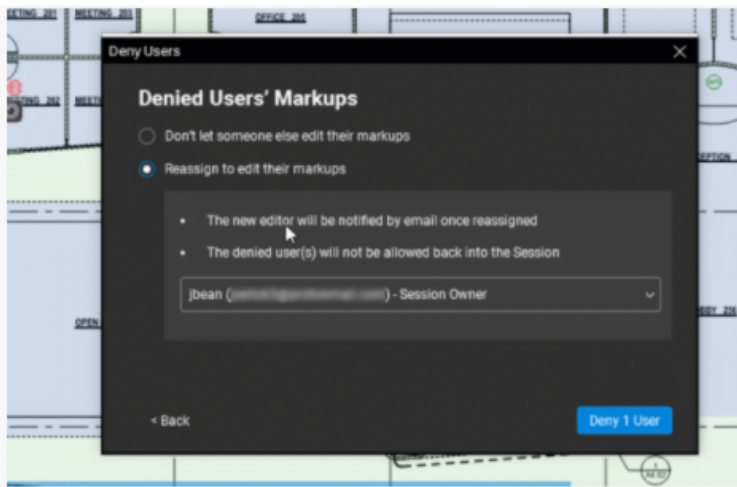
Incompatible Feature – Not Joined tab for Sessions and Projects

The **Not Joined** feature introduced with the initial release of Revu 20 is not compatible with Studio Enterprise. Revu will behave the same as it did in previous versions, where you only have access to the **Joined** list of Sessions/Projects. The **Not Joined** tab, as seen below, won't be visible when connected to Studio Enterprise.



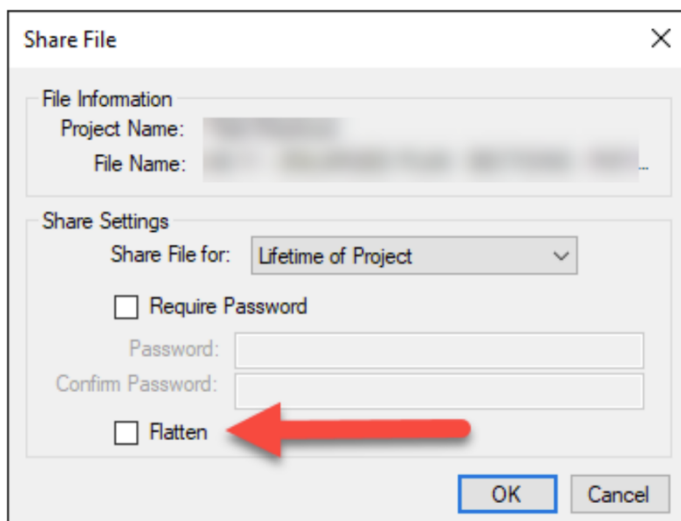
Incompatible Feature – Reassign Session Markup Ownership

The Revu 20.1 feature that allows you to securely reassign markup ownership when a collaborator permanently leaves a Session is not compatible with Studio Enterprise. Instead, Revu will behave as it did in previous versions. When you select "Deny" for an attendee, the following window won't appear.



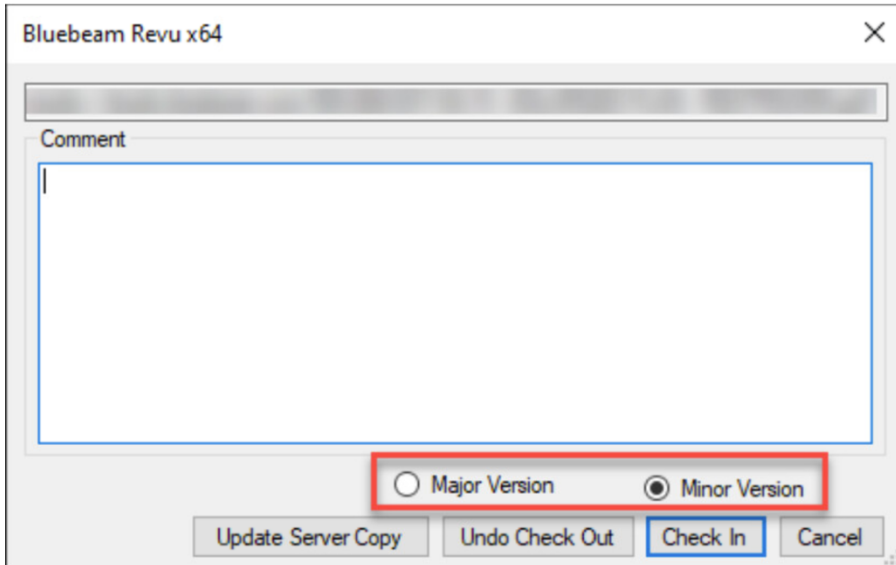
Incompatible Feature — Flatten when creating Share Link to Project File

If you select the **Share Link...** option for a Project file in Studio Enterprise, the Flatten option will not be available. If you want to share a flattened PDF from a Project, you will need to first manually run a Flatten (Ctrl+Shift+M) operation on it.



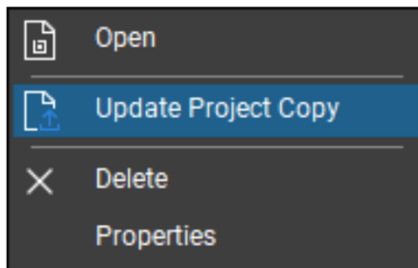
Incompatible Feature — Major/Minor Version selection when Checking In Project Files

Studio Enterprise doesn't allow you to select whether the changes to a file are Major or Minor version changes when checking in a Project file.



Incompatible Feature - Update Project Copy from Session

Studio Enterprise doesn't allow you to update a Project Copy from a file that is checked out to a Session. If you need to update the Project Copy, you will need to Finish the Session > Overwrite Existing Files > and then check the files back in.



Miscellaneous Issues

SMTP Email Server Issues

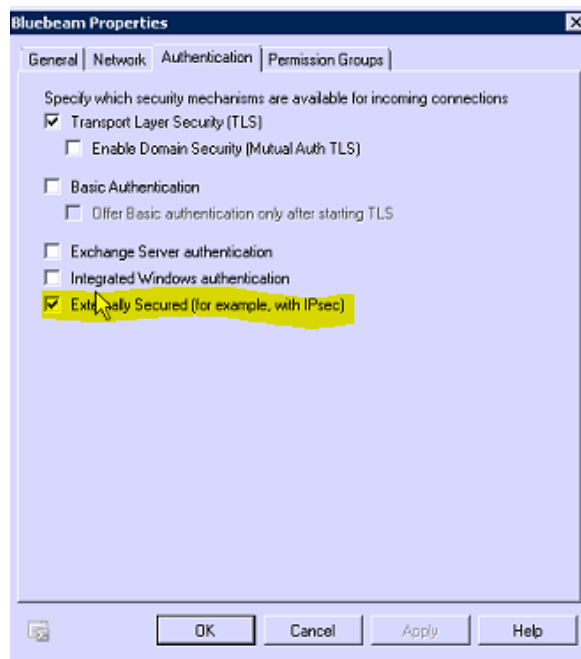
Problem

Studio emails are not successfully sent to users outside their network.

Solution

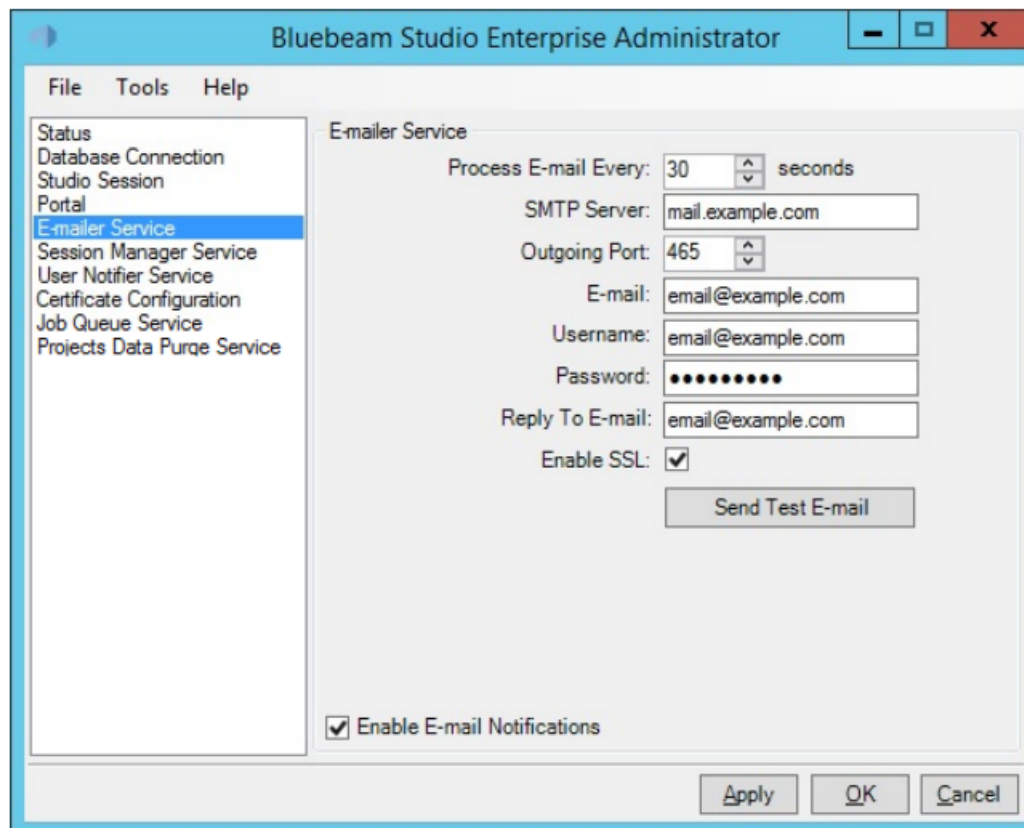
Check the following:

- Log into the Studio Portal with an administrator account and check the E-mails tab.
 - When Studio emails are successfully sent from the server, the status code for that e-mail in the Studio Web Portal is "200".
 - When the status code for an e-mail reads "999", the e-mail wasn't successfully sent.
 - All email statuses:
 - 0 = Pending
 - 100 = Sending
 - 200 = Sent
 - 999 = Error
- If a "999" error occurs and the Studio Enterprise administrator has set up their email client with Microsoft Exchange, check the "Externally Secured (for example, with IPsec)" option in the Exchange Management Console.



- Other Issues:
 - Reference SMTP sections in the [Studio Enterprise Installation and Configuration Guide](#).
 - Ensure all settings in the E-Mailer Service panel of the Bluebeam Studio Enterprise Administrator are valid:
 - Verify SMTP FQDN is valid and allows connections.
 - Ensure the port is valid and open.
 - Ensure the service account username is valid.
 - Ensure the associated password is correct and not expired.
 - Ensure e-mail and reply to e-mails addresses are valid.
 - Test with and without Enable SSL checked.
 - Send test e-mail in the E-Mailer Service panel.
 - Ensure **Enable E-mail Notifications** is selected in E-Mailer Service panel.
 - If you search the internet you can find web-based SMTP test tools. You can use one of these tools from the SE server to test the connection and troubleshoot.

- Check JobQueue.log for the following errors:
 - “Authentication failed because the remote party as close the transport system”. This error may be due to the changes on the SMTP server to only allow TLS 1.2 or newer. TLS 1.2 should be set as the default for the application server, with TLS 1.0 and TLS 1.1 being disabled. For more information, see <https://businesswintelligence.com/content/108/office-365-remote-party-closed-transport-stream>.
 - "ERROR Bluebeam.Studio.JobQueue.EmailerScheduledOperation — Unhandled exception System.Net.Mail.SmtpException: Server does not support secure connections." This error tends to occur when you have TLS 1.2 enabled on the server and have the **Enable SSL** option selected in the E-mailer Service section of the Bluebeam Studio Enterprise Administrator. To resolve the issue, please deselect **Enable SSL** in the Bluebeam Studio Enterprise Administrator.
- Ensure the Microsoft Messaging Queuing (MSMQ), Bluebeam Studio Job Queue, and Bluebeam Studio Services are all running.
- E-mailer Service settings example:



Slow Performance When Invitations or Notifications are Sent

Check the JobQueueService.log for the error, “Message submission rate for this client has exceeded the configured limit”. This error is a result of a MessageRateLimit being set on the SMTP server in question. You should remove the limit or use an SMTP server that does not have this limit set. For more information, see <https://www.servolutions.com/support/articles/messagesubmissionrate.htm>.

Maximum File Upload Size

By default, the maximum upload size of a document is 1GB. It is possible to increase this value from 1GB to the maximum possible upload size of 1.99GB. As a result, large files are unable to upload while smaller files upload

successfully.

The current limitation is due to the following reasons:

- In Revu, the HTTP client used to send requests to the server has a default limit of 2 GB within the code (on the Microsoft side) that limits file sizes that are read into memory before being sent.
- The current Studio Enterprise file upload implementation attempts to load the entire file into memory before saving it to the Studio database.
- Due to the IIS request size implementation, the content of each web request can only be a maximum of 1.99 GB. This maximum impacts all files uploaded.

To increase the upload file size from the current limit of 1 GB to 1.99 GB:

1. Connect to the Studio Enterprise 3.2 server.
2. Go to the directory: **C:\Program Files\Bluebeam Software\Studio\API**.
3. Run a text editor as an Administrator and open the Web.config file in that directory and locate the following block of XML:

Max Request Length & Content Length

4. Change the current values of the **maxRequestLength** and **maxAllowedContentLength** to the values shown above.

WARNING: These are the only values that should be modified within this file. Modifying any other values may cause significant/unforeseen problems.

5. Save the changes.
6. Restart the Bluebeam Studio Server IIS Site.

After this change, you will be able to upload up to 1.99 GB files to Studio Projects.

Note: If a file does not exceed the file limit and still fails to upload, it may be timing out. If a transfer takes 90 seconds or more, it may be timing out. To address this issue, ensure [file transfer speeds](#) are adequate.

Bluebeam Server (Services) Fail to Restart

Problem

The Bluebeam Services (Bluebeam Studio Job Queue & Bluebeam Studio Services) are failing to start. They may move into a starting state, but they never move to a running state.

Solution

Check the following:

- Attempt to restart the Bluebeam Services.
 1. Log into the Bluebeam Studio Enterprise portal.
 2. Select **Tools > Restart Server**.
Note: *If restarting fails, try a few more times. It sometimes takes 2-3 attempts to successfully restart.*
- Make sure the license or trial is still valid or not expired. Restart the services using the steps above.
- Check to make sure the certificate used is still valid.
 1. Log into the Studio Enterprise portal.
 2. Go to **Certificate Configuration > Change Certificate**.
 3. Select the current certificate for the server, then restart the services.

If you receive the error, "Could not find certificate that matches the Certificate Hash", the certificate may need to be updated, or you can follow the steps in the [Studio Sessions Markups are Not Updating in Real Time](#) section of this document.

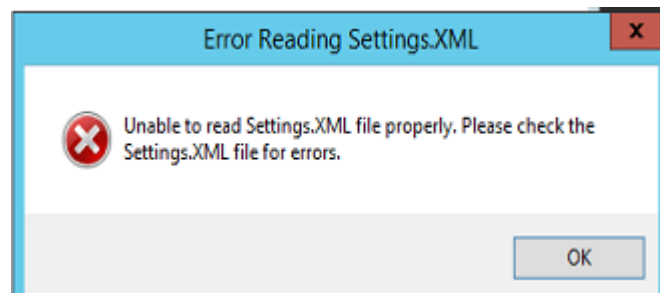
Note: *The server's certificate needs to be installed under Personal Certificates (NOT Trusted Root) as this is the Digital ID for the server.*

- Ensure that the IIS web site Binding is configured to use the correct certificate. For more information, see the [Certificate Change](#) section of this document.
- If services continue to fail, check the Studio log files and the Event Viewer for errors and additional information.
 - While normally benign, the following error may prevent your server from restarting: *[Server Thread] WARN Bluebeam.Studio.Collaboration.CServer - Could not find preferred IP address 0.0.0.0, will use first available IP.*
 - In this case ensure an IP Addressed is assigned in the Port 443 binding for the Bluebeam Studio Server site in IIS. Perform an IISRESET after this change.
 - The Event Viewer may point to an issue where a Settings.xml file cannot be found. This file is located in C:\ProgramData\Bluebeam Software\Studio. If there is a backup of a valid Settings.xml file in this location, rename it to "settings.xml".
- Ensure Services are set to auto-restart. This process can be found in the [Studio Server Trial Expired Error in Revu When Trying to Login](#) section.
- If all else fails, this can be resolved by reinstalling Studio Enterprise.

"Error Reading Settings.XML" error when opening Bluebeam Studio Administrator on Studio Enterprise Server

Problem

The "Error Reading Settings.XML" message appears when you open Bluebeam Studio Administrator on the Studio Enterprise server. Users may be unable to connect from Revu.



Solution

Check the following:

- Check the Windows Event Viewer for errors.
 - We have seen SQL exceptions indicating that the password for the service account expired. Updating the password resolved the issue.
 - The issue could also be that the SQL server is not responding or the SQL Server service is not running. Ensure the SQL server is running and reachable.
- An invalid value set may exist in the T_Configuration Table. If any changes were made to this table, roll back those changes.
- If you have a backup of a valid Settings.xml file, make a copy of the current Settings.xml and replace it with the backup. The Settings.xml file is located C:\ProgramData\Bluebeam Software\Studio on the Studio Enterprise server.
- If all else fails, reinstall Studio Enterprise.
Note: If the performance patch has been implemented, update the Settings.xml file with the Max Pool Size value set to 1024. As well as updated API files uploaded to C:\Program Files\Bluebeam Software\Studio\API.

IIS Worker Process Using All (or most) of the CPU

Problem

The IIS worker process is using all (or most) of the CPU.

Solution

Windows Update may have a pending required reboot. Reboot the server and ensure updates are completed.

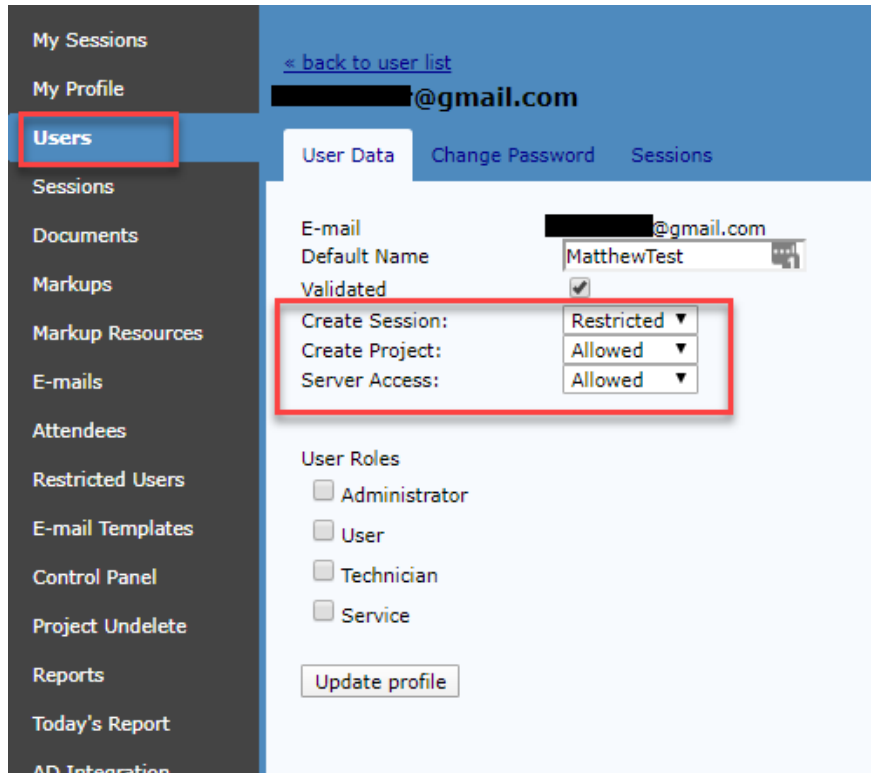
Users Cannot Create Sessions and/or Cannot Create Projects

Problem

Users are unable to create Studio Sessions and/or Projects in the Studio Enterprise environment.

Solution

- Verify the Users properties and the Server Permissions page within the Studio Enterprise portal. In the Users section, search for a user who is experiencing this behavior. Ensure they have Server Access set to “Allowed”. Restricted access will not allow them to access the Studio Enterprise server. The Create Session or Create Project settings will both keep the user from creating the respective object. If the user needs that function, ensure it is set to “Allowed” and that “Update profile” is selected. The following image illustrates a user who can’t create Sessions but can create Projects.



For more information, see the [Studio Enterprise Installation & Configuration Guide](#).

- If the Revu clients are 2016 or below, they may be unable to create Sessions due to the TLS version enabled. If this is the case, reference the [TLS Issue – Unable to Connect Using Revu 2016 and Older](#) section of this document.
- Check **Studio Enterprise Administrator** > **Status** and verify an IP address appears in the Hostname field. If so, change the hostname to the server FQDN. You must restart the server for the change to take effect.
- Verify if the BluebeamCache database exists on the SQL server.

Add Studio Enterprise Server to All Users — RevuPreferences.xml

You can use the Bluebeam Administrator command line to deploy a modified RevuPreferences.xml file that merges only the server settings to the users while preserving all other preferences.

To do so, use a text editor to open the RevuPreferences.xml file and add the following line to the beginning of the file before staging it for deployment:
Merge="True"

Example header:

After you perform this task, we recommend that you delete all other settings that you don't want to change.

To deploy the modified file, see the [Bluebeam Revu 20 Deployment Guide](#) or the [Bluebeam Revu 21 Deployment Guide](#) (depending on your version of Revu).

Note: Any sections specified in the merged XML file will overwrite those currently present. For example if a user has *studio.bluebeam.com* and *server1.company.local* present and the merge file only has a new server (*server2.company.local*) specified, the user will only have the new server after the merge. If other servers are needed, they will need to be specified in the merge preferences file.

You can also force the users to use certain Studio Servers. Doing so, however, disables the Manage Servers dialog box in Preferences. For more information, see the [Server Whitelist](#) section.

Server Whitelist – Force Allowed Studio Servers

Problem

If you use [RevuPreferences.xml](#) to set the default Studio server to your Studio Enterprise server, users may have their User overwritten with a default copy that reverts the server back to the default Studio server. This issue could occur because of a settings reset.

Solution

You can change the Studio Whitelist registry key to force users to use only specified Studio servers.

1. Run the Windows Registry Editor as an Administrator.
2. Navigate to "Computer\HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\Bluebeam Software".
3. Right-click the Revu version number, then select **New > Key**.
4. Name the new key "Studio".
5. Right-click **Studio** then select **New > String Value**.
6. Name the string value "AllowedServers".
7. Right click "AllowedServers" then select **Modify**.
8. In the **Value data** field, type the desired server name.
9. Select **OK**.
10. Close and reopen Revu.

Note: After you make this change, users will not be able to add/delete servers under the Manage Servers section of Studio which should keep this server locked in for you.

User Not Receiving Session Alerts or Seeing Markups

Problem

Session users are not seeing new markups or receiving alerts.

Solution

Ensure the Microsoft Message Queuing (MSMQ) service is running on the Studio Enterprise server. If messaging queueing has crashed, users will not be alerted or be able to see markups. If you wish to set the MSMQ service to auto recover, reference the [Studio Server Trial Expired Error in Revu When Trying to Login](#) section.

Migrating Studio Enterprise Data to Public Studio Servers

We don't currently have an automated process to migrate Studio Enterprise Sessions and Projects to our public Studio servers (studio.bluebeam.com, bluebeamstudio.co.uk, etc.), but you can follow our recommended manual procedures.

Note: If you wish to know more about our public Studio server offerings, please see the support article [Bluebeam Studio Regions](#), or reach out to Sales at sales@bluebeam.com or your Account Manager.

Sessions

1. Finish all current Sessions on Studio Enterprise and save the files.
2. Start new Sessions in Cloud and upload new files.

Note: When you upload a document into a new Session, the markups in the document at that time will become locked and you can no longer modify markups. You should not migrate Sessions on Studio Enterprise to Sessions on the Studio public server unless you no longer need to modify those markups.

Projects

1. Download a copy of existing Projects on Studio Enterprise.
 - a. When in the Project, right-click the root level.
 - b. Select **Download Copy**.

2. Create new Projects on the public Studio server.

3. Upload a copy of the Project to the public Studio server.

If you are only archiving this data and will not be uploading it to the public Studio server, you can skip the last two steps.

Note: If you are downloading Projects larger than 50 GB and encounter issues with the download process, you may want to avoid downloading the Project from the root level. Instead, download the folders below the root level. To learn the Project size, see the General tab in Project Settings.

We created some helpful queries that may help in the transition. Use this [download link](#) for scripts.

Scripts available for download:

- **ReportActiveProjects.txt** - This script is used to report all active Projects, so you can verify which Projects need to be migrated. You can use the Portal to see which Sessions are active.
- **ReportActiveSessions.txt** - This script is used to report all active Sessions, so you can verify which Sessions need to be migrated. You can also use the Portal to see which Sessions are active.
- **Unrestrict Projects.txt** - This script can change a Project from Restricted to Unrestricted and allow users access to a Project that was Restricted to download files.
- **DisableCreateSessionProjects.txt** - This script will disable a user's ability to create Projects/Sessions. The script includes comments to help apply the script to all users or restrict access to the Studio Enterprise server as a whole. This is a good script to run after everything has been moved to the cloud, and you want users to start using that instead.

Does Studio Enterprise support SAML Authentication?

Studio Enterprise supports LDAP connections for single sign-on.

Two-factor Authentication (2FA)

Studio Enterprise does not support 2FA, only Windows Authentication with LDAP.

Encryption

Document encryption occurs between the Revu client and the Studio Enterprise web server over SSL/TLS using port 443 while in transit. Documents are not encrypted in the users' [local Studio caches](#) on their local machines.

By default, documents are not encrypted in the SQL database; all docs live in the DB as binary blobs. You can enable encryption at the SQL Server level. However, this is not related to Bluebeam, but is specific to the SQL server. A skilled DBA will need to be involved if you chose to enable this. For more information about SQL Server encryption, see [Microsoft SQL Documentation](#).

Customizing Email Templates

To customize email templates:

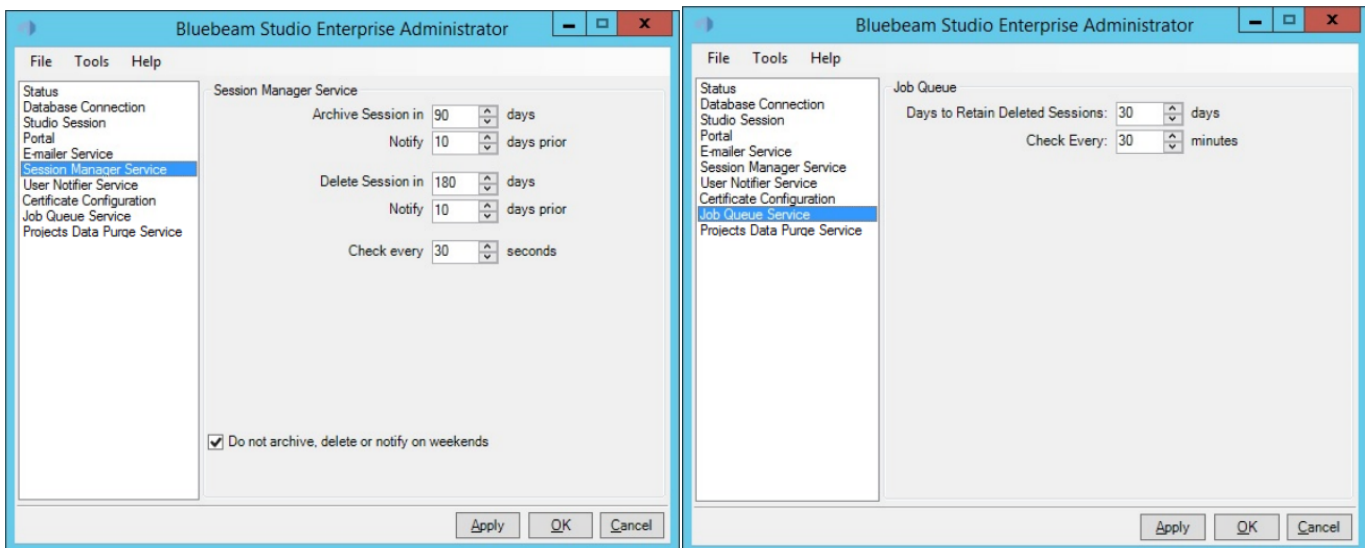
1. Log into your Studio Enterprise portal (by entering your Studio server name into a web browser).
2. On the left, click **E-mail Templates**.
3. Click one of the templates on the right of the window to customize it using HTML.
Note: While you can edit them individually, there is not a way to disable one and keep the rest enabled.

If you want to disable all email notifications:

1. Open the Studio Enterprise Administrator application.
2. In the left navigation, select E-mailer Service.
3. Deselect "Enable E-mail Notifications".

Session Archiving/Deletion/Purging

The following images display the default values for the Session Manager Service and the Job Queue Service, as detailed in the [Studio Enterprise Installation and Configuration Guide](#).



If these values are set, Sessions with no activity for 90 days will be moved from an Active state into an Archived state. That Session will remain in an Archived state for 180 days before it is moved into a Deleted state. Sessions that are manually Finished in Revu will also be moved into a Deleted state. Sessions in an Archived or Deleted state are still recoverable by the Session host or Studio Administrator by logging into Studio web portal, selecting the Session owner's account, then My Sessions, and finally double-clicking the Session to recover and set the Status value to **Active**.

The "Days to Retain Deleted Sessions" value on the Job Queue Service page comes into effect when Sessions are in a Deleted state. Using the values present above, Sessions in a Deleted state will be held for 30 days before being Purged. Once a Session is Purged, it is no longer recoverable. When Sessions meet the criteria, all Sessions will be purged in accordance with the "Check every" value.

The "Days to Retain Deleted Sessions" value in the Job Queue Service page also applies to documents in Sessions that have been deleted. For example, if a document has been deleted from a Session, but the Session is still in an Active or Archived state, that document will still be purged as a result of the Job Queue policy. If a document is deleted from an active Session, and the Days to Retain value is 30 days, that document will be purged after 30 days even though the Session is active.

Project Purging

Enable Projects Data Purge — Controls whether deleted Projects are eventually purged.

Purge deleted Projects — Specifies when Projects are purged after deletion.

Purge deleted Project items — Controls when files and folders are purged after their parent Project has been deleted.

Enable Projects File Revision Management — Determines whether file revisions are retained.

Maintain a maximum of — Sets the maximum number of retained file revisions.

Note: *Versions older than the maximum are automatically purged, and some actions – such as moving or “undeleting” files – are tracked in their revision histories, but don’t count as revisions.*

The “Project Data Purge” service setting is disabled by default.

Note: *Be sure your SQL server has sufficient hard drive space to hold all your Studio Projects.*

When the standard Project purge service is active, it will delete 100 Project items every hour. It doesn’t constantly purge in the background. If the purge service is off and is re-enabled, the service won’t perform a big purge operation. Sessions use a different process where it will purge all deleted Sessions that match criteria.
